[^] Texas law states that a core course at any Texas state funded College or University with transfer as "core" to any other Texas state funded College or University. Therefore, you may choose any core course from the list at that College or University.

^{^^} Student may take any core approved math course higher than MATH 1314 College Algebra to fulfill the Math Reasoning component.

- ◇ Core Complete status will be granted to students with an official transcript from a Texas state funded College or University stating that the core was completed at that institution.
- ◇ Some University of Houston degrees require specific core courses. Please see the current UH catalog, www.uh.edu/academics/catalog, for complete information on degree requirements.
- ◇ Students who currently attend UH should refer to their departmental advisor BEFORE taking courses at another college
- ◇ A minimum of 15 college-level (non developmental or remedial) hours are required to transfer to the University of Houston.
- ◇ A maximum of 66 college-level, lower division (1000/2000 level) hours, with a grade of C- or better, may apply to a UH degree.
- ◇ If you are planning on getting an Associate Degree, please see your counselor/advisor at your current institution to obtain a degree plan.
- ◇ To complete a Bachelor's Degree at UH, you are required to complete your last 30 hours of coursework at UH.

A maximum of 66 hours (grades C- or better) of 1000/2000 level transfer hours may be applied toward a UH degree.

TEXAS UNDERGRADUATE IN-STATE TUITION ENROLLMENT CAP

Students enrolling at a Texas public university or community college for the first time will be affected by the enrollment cap. There is now a limit on the number of hours those students may **attempt while paying in-state tuition**.
