> Education Certification as a secondary school teacher (grades 8-12) and All-Level school teacher (grades EC-12) are provided through the College of Education in conjunction with degree programs in the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences and the College of Natural Science and Mathematics.

> Courses are jointly approved by these colleges and the College of Education.

> For certification within a degree program in any of these two colleges, use the transfer guides for the specific major.

> The choice of major should correlate with what discipline the student would ultimately like to teach.

> Admission into the UH Teacher Education Program in Pre-Teaching Requirements:

> 2.50 GPA in overall education coursework and specialization area coursework

> Minimum THEA score in each of the following areas: Reading: 250, Math: 230, Writing: 240

> Courses listed above are **suggested** courses for this degree. Other courses in combination may apply to a degree. See department or course catalog for further information regarding your degree plan.

A maximum of 66 hours (grades C- or better) of 1000/2000 level transfer hours may be applied toward a UH degree.
