- Students **MUST** meet with the UH School of Art advisor before beginning the 3rd semester of college courses because of the specified sequence of courses that is required. Combining enrollment in core courses with major requirements will help maintain full-time enrollment.
- UH School of Art faculty must individually determine how courses not specifically listed above may apply to the degree plan of the intended major. Students are urged to retain syllabi and samples of work from these courses for UH faculty to review.
- Students who currently attend UH should check with their School of Art advisor **BEFORE** taking courses at another college.
