INCENTIVE FOR STUDENT GROUPS AT THE GREEN COMMUTER FAIR

Houston, January 27, 2010 – In an effort to rally student groups to sign up members for a METRO QCard, the University of Houston announces an incentive that will reward a pizza party to the group that refers the most people to next week's Green UH Commuter Fair.

Student groups seeking to be entered in the incentive program can e-mail their group name, contact person and contact information to gogreenuh@gmail.com. Groups should then encourage their members and friends to go sign up for a METRO QCard during the two day fair. Students signing up for the first time will be asked to indicate the group they were referred by on the registration form.



Students who have an existing METRO QCard may not register again. The student group that registers the most students will be rewarded with a pizza party valued at \$150.

The Green UH Commuter Fair will partner UH with Houston METRO to provide information to the community about METRO's services and other green commuting options. All UH students, faculty and staff can sign up for a METRO QCard. Full-time students will receive the discounted student card, saving 50% off the regular fare.

The fair scheduled for February 2 and 3 will be held from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Philip Hoffman Hall breezeway and the University Center Satellite.
