Students display proficiencies in oral mechanism exams and selected standardized tests along with goal writing, treatment planning and documentation, including lesson plans, daily logs, SOAP notes, treatment plans and progress reports. Multicultural and ethical practices are taught and reviewed. Students accrue 25 hours of clinical observation by licensed and certified speech-language pathologists in various settings in the Houston area.
