- Join a comprehensive network of students and alumni practitioners who are eager to positively shape our communities, community partner organizations and a university career center dedicated to helping students reach their goals.



- Fall
 - » Priority: March 1*
 - » International Applicants: May 1
 - » Domestic Applicants: August 1
- Spring
 - » Priority: September 1*
 - » International Applicants:October 1
 - » Domestic Applicants: December 1

GRE Waiver

Applicants with a GPA of 3.3 or higher or a graduate degree are not required to submit GRE scores.
