Chief Adcox joined the La Porte Police Department in July of 2008, after retiring from the El Paso Police Department. He served with the El Paso Police Department for 21 years, eventually ascending to the rank of Assistant Chief of Police. During his tenure, Chief Adcox worked a wide range of assignments, including positions in patrol operations, Gang Task Force, Crimes Against Children, Criminal Investigations, Narcotics, Major Crimes Investigations, Internal Affairs, and Special Operations.

In addition to now being a proud Certified Public Manager, Chief Adcox has a strong academic background with a Bachelors of Science Degree in Criminal Justice Administration.
