The F.E.E.T. Scholarship

Made possible through the generosity of two Honors alumni, Hanneke Faber and Aris Economon, the F.E.E.T. Scholarship is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to visit Europe. Scholarship recipients will receive airfare to/from Europe, a 3-week Eurail pass and a ~€1000.00 stipend (approximately \$1,250). Recipients of the scholarship will need to provide for any excess room, board, and related travel expenses, above the stipend, during their three weeks in Europe.

Qualifications

To be considered for the F.E.E.T. Scholarship, students must demonstrate the following:

- good standing in the Honors College and with the University of Houston (a 3.50 minimum cumulative gpa, completion of the Human Situation sequence, and a minimum of one Honors course per semester of participation in Honors (can be cumulative));
- completion of at least 3 semesters in Honors at the University of Houston (not counting summer semesters) with at least 2 semesters remaining following spring 2015--the equivalent of the sophomore or junior year (Spring 2015 and Fall 2015 graduates are ineligible to apply);
- already possess or be able to obtain a passport by February 2015;
- able to travel during May 18-June 7, 2015;
- have never previously traveled to Europe.

Supporting Materials and Application Deadline

Supporting materials for the F.E.E.T. Scholarship should include:

- an University of Houston transcript (may be an unofficial electronic transcript);***
- any other college transcripts (may be unofficial electronic transcripts);***
- an extracurricular resume;***
- one (1) 250-word essay;***
- class schedule (including outside commitments) for Spring 2015;***
- a digital photo submitted by email to kdmyrick@uh.edu.***

The extracurricular resume should include any special honors, awards, or distinctions you have received during your time at the University of Houston. The essay asks you to relate how you would benefit academically and personally as a recipient of the F.E.E.T. Scholarship (see page 4).

Your completed F.E.E.T. Scholarship application and supporting materials should be submitted to Keri Myrick, Executive Assistant to the Dean, in the Honors College Student Services office ***no later than 5:00 pm on Friday, November 7, 2014.*** Supporting materials should be submitted electronically to kdmyrick@uh.edu. Recipients will be announced on the Honors College website no later than Wednesday, November 26, 2014.
