- Differences between Masters and PhD
  - Both take classes, see clients, do research, write thesis
  - Masters
    - 2 years
    - Can go back later for PhD
  - PhD
- 4 years with 1 year practical
- More research
- Write dissertation
- Opens more opportunities for career
- Can see a larger range of clients
- Get Master's on the way

#### o Research

- Convey the depth of your experience in your personal statement (if not long period of experience)
- Faculty research interests listed on website, so decide which faculty members you'd be interested in working under
- Write your personal statement leaning towards specific faculty members' interests
  - Indicate 2 advisors you'd like to work with
- Email the professors for RA position if need more experience
- Look into a program you are not interested in applying to, because some professors do not want to accept grad students that they have already worked with as an undergrad
- Look into taking grad classes as an undergrad
- They just want to see that you know how to do studies; it is okay if you have experience in one program and you're applying to a different program
- Applying
  - Recommendation letters
  - CV resume for grad school
  - Personal statement
    - Research interest in general
    - Interested research for future
    - Research experience
  - She applied to 5 schools, which is a little low compared to the norm

- Other people in her program applied to between 13-16
  - They interviewed at about half the places to which they applied
- Email the professor you want to work with and see if they are accepting new students
- Forensic programs

  - UNT
  - Sam Houston State
  - UTEP
  - Tuscaloosa (in Alabama)
  - UT
  - Fordham (in New York)
  - UVA
  - UT Southwestern
  - Apply to clinical program and see which faculty member is researching in forensics
- Contact
  - Email the professor you want to work with in August or September
    - Then they know whether they are accepting
    - It also helps, because they will see your name again on the application and know you are really interested and motivated
- GRE scores
  - Some schools post stats on their websites
  - Some PhD programs have a cut off of 1000
  - Do not let the score mean discourage you
    - If you are prepared to accept an offer from them, convey that in your personal statement
