## Program Highlights



GCSW students are making the most of the Unique Opportunities offered by our program while also providing valuable contributions and service to improve communities. Right now, in Austin, the GCSW Legislative interns are learning the ins and outs of advocacy, policy and political social work. And they're blogging about it! This week, GCSW student Rob Block, writes, about House Bill 233, proposed by Rep. Jessica Farrar. He shares a specific example of how policy considerations in the legislature can impact social work practice.

"One task that has been interesting is working bills. Representative Farrar has proposed more than 20 bills; a handful of which I am in charge of working. This means doing research and writing to make a strong case for bills that my Representative has filed.

One bill that I believe will be of interest to social workers is House Bill 233, which the office has dubbed the ISchool Social Work Bill. I HB 233 is a bill that adds a brief description of the role of a school social worker to the Texas Education Code.

There is currently no definition of the services school social workers may provide in the Education Code..."
