Assistant and Associate Professors

Applications are invited for three tenure-track faculty positions for Fall 2015 at the rank of either Assistant or Associate Professor. The Graduate School of Social Work (GSSW) at the University of Denver (DU) is seeking to expand our expertise in one or more of the following areas: community practice; mental health; family systems interventions; health; global practice; the human-animal bond and animal-assisted social work. GSSW seeks colleagues whose innovative ideas and research agenda support our mission of educating MSW and PhD students. GSSW and the University of Denver are committed to enhancing the diversity of faculty and staff. As such, we especially encourage people from historically underrepresented populations to apply. Candidates for a position at the rank of Assistant Professor must have an earned doctorate in social work or in a related social science discipline by September 1, 2015, an MSW degree, a developing research agenda and potential for excellence in teaching across the MSW curriculum. Two or more years of post-MSW practice experience is preferred. Candidates must demonstrate a commitment to research, scholarly publication, and preparation of research proposals for external funding. In addition to the degree requirements above, candidates at the rank of Associate Professor should have a strong record of accomplishments in scholarship, external funding, teaching, and mentoring master's and doctoral students. Candidates should have cumulative experience and a background that is commensurate with the rank of Associate Professor; tenure will be considered at the time of hire.

The Graduate School of Social Work is a community of scholars who conduct a range of research with diverse populations across the life cycle and who are committed to excellence in teaching. The School's curriculum, research, and community partnerships emphasize social and economic justice, along with an understanding of and respect for social, political, and cultural diversity. GSSW provides a collegial and supportive environment that fosters interdisciplinary research. The faculty at GSSW engages in major collaborative projects locally, nationally, and internationally. In addition, the Denver metropolitan area affords excellent opportunities for interdisciplinary research addressing a variety of populations.

Applicants should submit their curriculum vita, a letter that illustrates their interests and expertise in teaching and research, and two samples of written/published material in which the candidate contributed substantially to the writing and conceptualization of the manuscript to the University's online application system at the University of Denver website [www.du.edu/hr/employment/jobs](http://www.du.edu/hr/employment/jobs) (*only online applications can be considered*).
