Mary Bell Behavioral Health Clinical Fellow

AVAILABLE: Application submission by 2/24/14, position begins 6/1/2014

HOURS: 37.5 hours per week, includes some nights and weekends

SUMMARY: The Mary Bell Behavioral Health Clinical Fellow is responsible for providing individual, couple, family and group psychotherapy and also expected to attend weekly didactic courses as a mandatory job requirement. Fellow is thought of as a practitioner-scholar & to be an ambassador for the agency. Their work should reflect our high standards for clinical practice, our connection to the local community & our commitment to ongoing education and training..

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES: Clinical licensure - including intern status for LMSW, LPC or LMFT. Clinical Responsibilities include: co-facilitating Intensive Out-Patient (IOP) and/or Supportive-Outpatient (SOP) groups; co-facilitate aftercare groups, education class or parent group; Clinical Assessment Share in individual caseload of clients, including documentation; Clinical Assessment, Diagnosis & Treatment; Participate in Interdisciplinary Didactics; Participate in Individual and Group Clinical Supervision and in Weekly clinical rounds with entire Dept. Didactic Responsibilities are included in work week.

Application/Interview Process:

Applicants for fellowship will complete an application that includes the following:

1. Autobiographical Statement. This should be 4 pages and discuss how your interest in the helping field began as well as pertinent information about how your personal life informs your professional life.
2. Submission of CV/Resume
3. 3 Letters of recommendation from current/past clinical supervisors and/or professors
4. Case formulation that demonstrates clinical work experience. Should be 4-5 pages and should discuss a particular case that you have had that demonstrates your clinical work. Focus specifically on dynamics of transference/counter transference and your formulation of the client. Include a brief history of the client and a multi-axial diagnosis. If applicable, demonstrate challenges faced in the treatment that you had to work through.

In addition, applicants will be required to also submit necessary documentation required by the agency for regular job applicants.

The interview process will consist of multiple interviews with members of the clinical staff that will be part of fellowship training and co-facilitating. Input will be considered and reviewed from all interviewers and final recommendations regarding candidates will be made by the Chief Operations Officer with final approval from the President/CEO.
