

**Assistant Clinical Faculty Position
Online Program Coordinator, Department of Social Work
University of New Hampshire**

The Department of Social Work at the University of New Hampshire (UNH) invites applications for one full-time Clinical Assistant Professor to coordinate its online MSW program beginning January 2014. As part of their duties, this faculty member will be expected to oversee the admissions process, advise online students, and teach online courses in the graduate social work program. The University actively creates and nurtures a dynamic learning environment in which qualified individuals of differing perspectives, life experiences, and cultural backgrounds pursue academic goals with a mutual respect and shared spirit of inquiry.

Requirements for Clinical Assistant Professor Position:

- An MSW degree,
- A record of excellence in online teaching in an accredited Social Work program,
- Demonstrated competence with online teaching technology (e.g., platforms, synchronous tools, social media, web-based tools),
- An ability to teach online in at least 1 Core MSW curriculum area (e.g., Human Behavior and the Social Environment, Policy, Practice, Research, Race, Culture and Oppression),
- Defined area of expertise in a Field of Practice (e.g., Addictions and Substance Abuse; Children, Youth and Families; Disability; or Health and Mental Health),
- An ability to administer an online graduate social work program,
- A minimum of three years post-MSW social work practice experience,
- A demonstrated ability to work collaboratively in both college campus and community settings with faculty, staff, students, and community groups of diverse backgrounds.

The Department of Social Work operates an accredited undergraduate program with 100 undergraduate majors and three graduate programs including an online program and two face-to-face programs in Durham (Main Campus) and an off-campus site in Manchester, NH. The Durham and Manchester programs serve approximately 130 students and it is anticipated that the online program will serve 40-50 students. All three Graduate programs offer an Advanced Generalist curriculum with options for specialization in one of the following fields of practice: (1) substance use disorders, (2) children, youth and families, (3) disability, or (4) health and mental health.

The University of New Hampshire is the state's public research university, providing comprehensive, high-quality undergraduate programs and graduate programs of distinction. Its primary purpose is learning: students collaborating with faculty in teaching, research, creative expression, and service. The University of New Hampshire has a national and international agenda and holds land-grant, sea-grant and space-grant charters.
