### Announces an Assistant Professor Position

**Faculty position.** UM-St. Louis invites candidates to apply for an assistant professor position beginning the 2015/16 academic year. We are looking for candidates with an active research agenda, an earned doctorate, and a macro-level focus. An MSW plus two years of post-Master's experience is preferred, and all qualified candidates will be considered. The successful candidate for the position will teach courses for both the BSW and MSW programs. Salary is competitive and will be based on experience and qualifications.

**The School of Social Work.** With 550 BSW, MSW, and MS in Gerontology students, UM-St. Louis' School of Social Work is a vibrant and growing program. It is the only public graduate social work program in the eastern part of Missouri and draws a diverse group of traditional and non-traditional students. The School of Social Work is recognized for excellent teaching, service, and scholarship. Pilot research funds, teaching enhancement awards and travel grants are available at the campus and university levels. The library system offers access to a wide variety of social work research and writing and provides rapid access to all major research libraries in the state. The School houses the campus Gerontology Graduate programs and the Center for Family Research and Policy. It has close ties with the Center for Excellence in Financial Counseling, the Non-Profit Management and Leadership program, the Gender Studies Program, the Trauma Studies Center, International Studies and Programs, and the Public Policy Research Center.

**The University.** UM-St. Louis is a research and teaching campus with 33 Masters and 14 Doctoral programs in addition to its 49 Bachelor degrees. **St. Louis.** The city and region offer ample opportunities for urban social workers to conduct research, engage students, and become involved in the community, including rapidly growing immigrant communities. The university is located near the Ozark Mountains and the Mississippi Delta where rural social workers will encounter ample research and teaching opportunities. St. Louis is home to nationally-recognized cultural institutions, including the art museum and zoo. The internationally renowned Botanical Garden draws visitors and researchers from around the world.
