MISSION

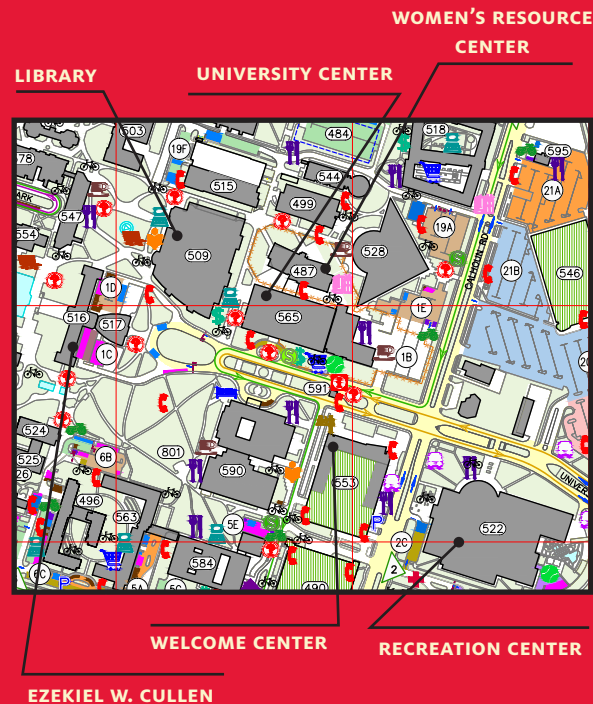
To advocate, educate, and provide supportive services for the advancement of gender equity on campus, with an emphasis on student safety, health and success

INTERNSHIPS

The WRC is pleased to be an internship site for several graduate programs. Students will gain experience in program planning, working with students, and learning about women's issues.

PROGRAMS

Gender Talk – A weekly opportunity to learn about current gender issues in an informal discussion group

Start Smart – A program presented once a semester to inform students about the wage gap and how they can successfully negotiate for their first salary upon graduation

The Vagina Monologues – A theatrical performance presented each year by students to celebrate women's bodies and their lives. The performance is also a fundraiser for a local Houston nonprofit that serves women.

Take Back the Night March – An annual event in the fall to educate students about sexual assault on college campuses

Summer Book Club – A yearly event where we select and read two books, often by and about women, over the course of the summer, one fiction and one nonfiction, with a lively discussion to follow

RESOURCES

The WRC offers free feminine hygiene products, over the counter pain relievers, condoms, and Band-Aids to support our students.

Mother's (Lactation) Rooms – The WRC manages lactation rooms across campus to serve our new parents.

VOLUNTEERS

WRC volunteers help our small staff do the work of the WRC by tabling, helping at events and around the office. A great introduction to women's issues and the campus community.

THE WRC ALSO WELCOMES MEN

The WRC is your place, too! Although "gender" is often used as a proxy for "women," men have a gender, too. Restrictive gender role stereotypes about men and masculinity abound. Also, many issues that have historically been called "women's issues" are significant to all members of our campus community, such as sexual assault and relationship violence. Male students, staff and faculty are welcome to attend WRC programs and take advantage of WRC resources, whether for themselves or on behalf of women in their lives. Men are also welcome as WRC volunteers.
