### Requirements to Apply

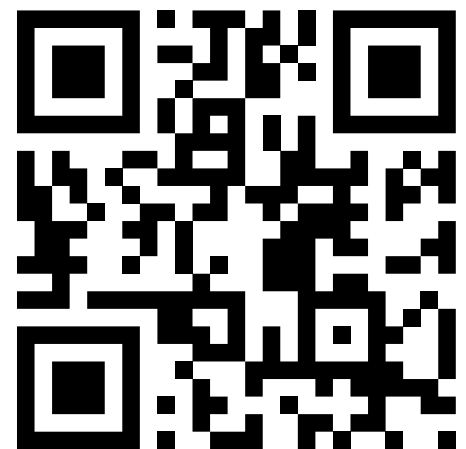
- Enrolled as an undergraduate student at UH
