    - 1. Answer questions from last meeting
      - a. eBook pros/cons
        - i. pros can access anywhere; don't have to carry book around
        - ii. cons depends on a student's study habits if it is a good fit; faculty may not allow electrical devices during lectures
        - iii. trend is changing and eBooks are gaining popularity around
        - 1,300 eBooks were available last year
        - iv. Download method and ownership periods depend on publisher
      - b. NookStudy promotions
        - i. free application from Barnes and Noble
        - ii. will discuss further in presentation
      - c. Update on Textbook Affordability Committee
        - i. over years, members have moved on and committee needs to be re-established.
    - 2. Presentation Bookstore update
      - a. Financial Sales (May 2011 October 2011)
        - i. Total sales for Main, Law and Sugarland stores up from last year

#### b. Textbooks

- i. Adoptions at 40% as of time of meeting
- ii. key targets 90% by Dec. 1, 75% by May 1 for Summer and Fall 2012
- iii. another communication will be sent to faculty next week
- iv. students are already researching bookstore will match prices
- v. Bookstore welcomes feedback on best methods of communication

- ii. Live display in main bookstore
- iii. Committee makes suggestions to reach out to Residential Life and Housing, Learning Support Center to teach students how to use the free application may help their study habits

#### d. General Merchandise

- i. 3% increase in clothing sales and school spirit gifts over last year
- ii. Sustainability Bookstore is now an Alta Gracia flag ship store which allows more product selection
- iii. Committee would like to see more professional clothing options
- iv. Departments can order shirts through campuscasuals.com Bookstore will see if they would like to do a presentation at a future meeting

- ii. Sales significantly up in uhfanshop.com, Robertson Stadium
- iii. Game Day Sales at \$73,590 for all stadium locations with highest game sales during East Carolina game
- iv. Athletic Partnership Highlights and Promotions 5-star Security caps, Monday Morning Money Back, featured item during game, rented storage pod for fan shop sales at Robertson Stadium
- v. Opportunities phone lines for credit card purchases fail consistently; need better technology to speed up process
