THE CONCERNS

- Current meal plans discourage living on campus
- Meal plans are especially unfriendly to low-income students
- The Cougar 160 plan is a poor value
- Students often have unused meals

COMPARISON

- Compared to 17 peer institutions identified by UH (125+ meal plans)
- 13 out of the 17 offer a lower-cost option to mandated students
- 6 of 17 mandate fewer groups of students to purchase a meal plan
- 8 of 17 have meal exchange programs or only flex-cash plans

THE FIX (WELL, IMPROVEMENT)

- 1. Offer smaller, lower-cost meal plans
- 2. Discount Cougar 160 plan
- 3. Consider exchange program
- 4. Review meal plan pricing
- 5. Establish donation program
