2026 Designated Scholarships

Michael Maraldo, Sr. Southwest Terrazzo Association Architecture Scholarship

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000

The Southwest Terrazzo Association provides annual funding for eight scholarships a year for students enrolled in the Texas schools of architecture (one scholarship awarded per school).

Criteria

- Students must have completed at least three years of their architecture program.
- Student must be pursuing a career in architecture.

Wichita Falls Chapter AIA Scholarship

Scholarship Amount: \$1,000

The Wichita Falls Chapter AIA established a scholarship endowment in 1991 to provide assistance to deserving students pursuing a professional career in architecture. The chapter now provides eight scholarships to architecture students enrolled in each of the Texas schools of architecture. (One awarded per school)

Criteria

- An eligible student has completed at least two years of a pre-professional or professional architecture program.
- Student must be a U.S. Citizen.
- Student is on the path to licensure, seeking a professional degree in architecture.
- First preference to be given to a student who is from the Wichita Falls Chapter area.

2026 Competitive Scholarships

Dockery Architecture Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$2,000
Competitive among all schools

Established in 2024, this scholarship is available on a competitive basis to any student who has completed at least 2 years of a pre-professional or professional architectural program.

Criteria

- Eligible student shall be in good academic standing.
- Student shall demonstrate financial need.
- Student shall be a U.S. Citizen on the path to licensure and seeking a professional degree in architecture

Edwin W. and Alyce O. Carroll Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$1,500
Competitive among all schools

Endowed in 2000 through a bequest from El Paso architect Edwin W. Carroll, FAIA, to provide support to a fourth-year architecture student enrolled in one of the Texas schools of architecture. Carroll was a past president of the Texas Society of Architects and the Texas Architectural Foundation. He received the Society's Medal for Lifetime Achievement in 1983.

Criteria

- Undergraduate students will have completed three years of a preprofessional or professional architecture program, pursuing a professional career in architecture.
- Eligible students will be in their fourth (4th) year of an architecture program in the upcoming fall semester.
- Demonstrates ability and potential.
- Selection is based on professional potential in achievement and need for financial assistance.
- Student to submit portfolio (PDF) and a completed TAF application.

Competitive Scholarship
George F. Harrell | OMNIPLAN Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$1,500

Established in 1980 through a bequest by George F. Harrell II, FAIA, to assist deserving architecture students pursue an architectural education. Mr. Harrell was an esteemed Dallas architect and one of the original founders of the architecture firm OMNIPLAN.

Criteria

- Undergraduate students have completed at least three years of a preprofessional or
- professional architectural program, entering the fourth year or higher in the upcoming
- academic year.
- Graduate students currently enrolled in or accepted into the Master of Architecture program in the upcoming academic year are eligible.
- Student is pursuing a professional career in architecture.
- Student's hometown is within the State of Texas. Hometown is generally where the student is originally from and/or where student graduated high school.
- Student demonstrates design ability and potential, is in good academic standing, and has need for financial assistance.
- Student to submit portfolio (PDF) and a completed TAF application.

Competitive Scholarship

San Antonio Conservation Society Foundation Scholarship Honoring Brooks Martin, FAIA Scholarship Amount: \$2,500

The San Antonio Conservation Society Foundation funds two scholarships annually to support talented architecture students who demonstrate interest in historical architecture, preservation and adaptive reuse. The purpose of the San Antonio Conservation Society: to preserve and to encourage the preservation of historic buildings, objects, places and customs relating to the history of Texas, its natural beauty and all that is admirably distinctive to our State; and by such physical and cultural preservation, to keep the history of Texas legible and intact to educate the public, especially the youth of today and tomorrow, with knowledge of our inherited regional values.

Criteria

- An outstanding architecture student who has completed at least three years of an architecture program and has at least one year of education remaining.
- Available to undergraduate, graduate or doctorate candidates.

Eligibility

- Student is pursuing architecture degree and demonstrates an emphasis in historical architecture, preservation, and adaptive reuse; or
- Student has a degree in architecture and is pursuing a Certificate in Historic Preservation, and/or enrolled in a graduate level architecture program with a concentration in Historic Preservation; or
- Student is participating in a school study program with travel to historically significant sites or, where historical architecture, preservation and adaptive reuse are important components of study.

Other

Applicants to submit TAF application form, portfolio, and a written description of either a proposed travel program or research project, or a description of interest, experience, activities and special studies demonstrating emphasis in historical architecture, preservation, and/or adaptive reuse.

Student may include a sample of his/her related writing. Resume may be included.

The student's proposal or program description to address purpose, scope if a research project or special program.

For travel program, include location and overview of study program. May include estimated budget for materials or travel if part of the specialized study.

Note: The recipient is required to provide a summary report of completed study program, travel or research project and support materials (a written document, sketchbook, or digital presentation) to the San Antonio Conservation Society within

three months following the travel, project or program completion. To be completed in the academic year of the award.

Grayson Gill Memorial Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$1,200
Competitive among all schools

This endowment was established in 1984 by Dallas architect G. Douglas Gill, AIA in memory of his father Grayson Gill, AIA, to assist deserving architecture students. Offered on a competitive basis to graduate level students enrolled in or have been accepted into the professional Master of Architecture program.

Abilene Chapter AIA Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$4,800
Competitive among all eight schools

Endowed by the Abilene Chapter of the American Institute of Architects in 1987 to provide assistance to deserving architecture students from the chapter area who are pursuing a professional career in architecture.

Criteria

- This scholarship is available on a competitive basis to a deserving architecture student who is from the Abilene Chapter area.
- Available to qualified students who have completed at least two years of a preprofessional or professional architecture program; will be in the third year or higher in the upcoming academic year. Graduate level architecture students are eligible.
- Student is from the AIA Abilene Chapter area.
- (Hometown is within one of the following Texas counties served by AIA Abilene: Brown, Callahan, Coke, Coleman, Concho, Fisher, Jones, McCulloch, Menard, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, or Taylor County.)
- Financial need is considered for this award.
- Student demonstrates design ability and potential.

AIA Amarillo Chapter Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$4,500
Competitive among all eight schools

Endowed by the Amarillo Chapter of the American Institute of Architects in 2010, this scholarship is made available to a deserving student from the AIA Amarillo Chapter area who is pursuing a professional career in architecture.

Criteria

- Undergraduate students will have completed at least two years of a preprofessional or professional architecture program, enrolled in their third year or higher in the upcoming academic year.
- Graduate students enrolled in or accepted into the Master of Architecture program in the upcoming academic year are eligible.
- Demonstrates ability and potential. Student is in good academic standing.
- Student's Hometown is within one of the Texas counties served by the AIA Amarillo Chapter: Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Donley, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, or Wheeler County.
- Financial need is also considered for this award.

AIA Corpus Christi Chapter Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$1,500
Competitive among all eight schools

This endowed scholarship is offered by the Corpus Christi Chapter of the American Institute of Architects to provide assistance to an architecture student whose hometown is within the chapter area.

Criteria

- Undergraduate students will have completed at least two years of architecture coursework, entering the third year or higher of a preprofessional or professional architecture program.
- Graduate students in any level of study in the Master of Architecture program in the upcoming academic year are eligible.
- Student is pursuing a professional career in architecture.
- Student is U.S. Citizen who is from the Corpus Christi Chapter area. Hometown is in a Texas county served by the Corpus Christi Chapter: Jim Wells, Kleberg, Nueces, or San Patricio County.
- Applicant demonstrate talent, ability and positive qualities.
- Has need of financial assistance.
- Maintains a GPA of 2.5 or higher in their major.

Student to submit portfolio (PDF) and a completed TAF application.

El Paso Chapter AIA Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$3,300
Competitive among all eight schools

Endowed in 1989 by the El Paso Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, this scholarship is made available to architecture students from the El Paso Chapter area, who are pursuing a professional career in architecture. The scholarship is available to all eight Texas schools of architecture on a competitive basis.

Criteria

- Undergraduate students have completed at least two years of a preprofessional or professional architecture program, entering the third year or higher in the upcoming academic year.
- Architecture students who have completed the two-year El Paso Community College architecture foundation program and have been accepted into one of the eight Texas Universities architecture programs are eligible.
- Graduate students enrolled in or accepted into the Master of Architecture program in the upcoming academic year are eligible.
- Student demonstrates outstanding architectural talent. Financial need is a secondary criterion.
- Student is from the El Paso Chapter area and pursuing a professional career as an architect.
- Student's hometown is within one of the Texas counties served by the AIA El Paso Chapter: Brewster, Culberson, El Paso, Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, Loving, Pecos, Presidio, Reeves, Terrell, Ward, and Winkler County.

AIA Northeast Texas E. Davis Wilcox, FAIA, Memorial Scholarship in Architecture
Scholarship Amount: \$2,000
Competitive among all schools

AIA Northeast Texas, a section of AIA Dallas, established a scholarship in memory of founding member E. Davis Wilcox, FAIA. Dave was an athlete, war veteran, architect, and community leader amongst other noted accomplishments. This scholarship is available to students enrolled in an architecture program at one of the eight schools of architecture in Texas, who are from the AIA Northeast Texas area.

Criteria

- Eligible undergraduate students have completed at least two years of a preprofessional or professional architecture degree program; enrolled in their third year or higher in the upcoming academic year.
- Graduate level architecture students enrolled in or accepted into the professional Master of Architecture program, or post professional architecture program in the upcoming academic year are eligible.
- Student's hometown is in one of the Texas counties served by AIA Northeast Texas: Anderson, Angelina, Bowie, Camp, Cass, Cherokee, Gregg, Harrison, Marion, Morris, Nacogdoches, Panola, Rusk, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby, Smith, Titus, or Upshur County.

- Demonstrates ability and professional potential. Student to provide a concise portfolio.

Criteria

- Eligible undergraduate students have completed two or more years of an undergraduate pre-professional or professional architecture degree program, entering the third year or higher in the upcoming academic year.
- Students enrolled in any level of graduate study in the Master of Architecture program in the upcoming academic year are eligible.
- Student has a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Has need for financial assistance.
- Demonstrates ability and potential.
- Student is from (hometown within*) one of the Texas counties served by the AIA San Antonio Chapter: Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Dimmit, Edwards, Frio, Gillespie, Gonzales, Guadalupe, Kendall, Kerr, Kimble, Kinney, Llano, Mason, Maverick, Medina, Real, Uvalde, Val Verde, Wilson, and Zavala County.

AIA Southeast Texas Douglas E. Steinman, Jr., FAIA, Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$2,300
Competitive among all eight schools

Criteria

- Available on a competitive basis to architecture students who are from the AIA Southeast Texas, pursuing a professional career in architecture.
- Eligible students, undergraduate or graduate, have completed at least two years of coursework, entering the third year or higher of a preprofessional or professional architecture program for the upcoming academic year.
- Demonstrates ability and potential in architecture.
- Student is from the AIA Southeast Texas Chapter area.
- Hometown is in one of the following AIA Southeast Texas counties:
- Chambers, Hardin, Jasper, Jefferson, Liberty, Orange, Newton, or Tyler County.
- (Does not include Harris or Galveston County.)

AIA Waco Memorial Scholarship
Scholarship Amount: \$2,000
Competitive among all eight schools

Established in 1984 by the Waco Chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) to assist deserving students from the Chapter area pursuing an architectural degree and professional career in architecture. Available on a competitive basis.

Criteria

- Student has completed at least two years of a preprofessional or professional architecture program, entering their third year or higher of an undergraduate architecture program in the upcoming academic year.
- A graduate student in any level of study in the Master of Architecture program is eligible.
- Student is from the Waco Chapter area; Maintains 2.75 GPA or above.
- Has need of financial assistance.
- Demonstrates design ability and potential.
- Student's hometown is in one of the Texas counties served by AIA Waco: Bell, Bosque, Coryell, Falls, Hamilton, Hill, Lampasas, Limestone, McLennan, Mills, or San Saba County.

Student to submit portfolio (PDF) and a completed TAF application.

- Graduate students enrolled in or accepted into the Master of Architecture program are eligible.
- Student is pursuing a professional career as an architect.
- Is in good academic standing and has need of financial assistance.
- Demonstrates design ability and talent.
- Student is from the AIA West Texas Chapter area.
- Hometown is in one of the following Texas counties: Andrews, Crane, Crockett, Ector, Glasscock, Howard, Irion, Martin, Midland, Schleicher, Sterling, Sutton, Tom Green,
• or Upton County.

Student to submit portfolio (PDF) and a completed TAF application.
