
ALAN BRUTON

Alan Bruton, NCARB, NCIDQ, has joined the University of Houston's Gerald D. Hines School of Architecture and Design as Director of Interior Architecture.

Prior to joining the University of Houston, Alan taught full-time in the School of Constructed Environments at Parsons School of Design at The New School in New York. Alan is principal of Alan Bruton Studio, an interdisciplinary design studio founded in 2000 after more than a decade of working with architects, exhibition and interior designers, curators and artists on a wide range of projects.

As an associate with the Architecture Research Office, he won several awards as the Project Architect for the Times Square Armed Forces Recruiting Station. He has contributed to projects for photographer Larry Clark, Gianni Versace, the Catholic Church, the Dalai Lama and Prada. Direct commissions have included exhibition designs for the International Center of Photography, Cooper Hewitt National Design Museum, and the Venice Architecture Biennale. His work has been exhibited at the Generali Foundation in Vienna, Gandi Galerie in the Slovak Republic, SouYun Yi Gallery and Gallery B in New York.

With his Masters in Architecture from Cranbrook Academy of Art, and a Bachelor of Environmental Design from Texas A&M University, Alan's practice and research critically explore relationships between material, procedural, formal, spatial, economic and sociocultural issues, in ongoing dialog with practitioners of diverse modes of cultural research and production.
