## **PRESENTATION GUIDELINES**

When creating your presentation, keep in mind that it should be engaging. Try to stay away from plain slides that have massive amounts of content. Make sure to include pictures of your chapter members completing community service hours or spending quality time together at your siblinghood/chapter events. If you have a video or reel that you would like to play, add it in!

As for the content, always remember that less is more on the slide. Keep paragraphs to a minimum and list out the facts. For example, service hours completed, your overall chapter GPA, money raised and donated to your philanthropy/specific cause your chapter focuses on, etc. If you had any members attend a leadership conference on behalf of your chapter or they were recognized for an award, include that too! This is the time to showcase all of the hard work you and your chapter members have done based on these 5 focus areas.

## **PRESENTATION TIPS**

When discussing the 5 focus areas, it might be beneficial to have 1 or a few slides pertaining to each area. The following are examples of what you can discuss per slide:

- Intellectual Development: Chapter academic goals; Chapter scholarship plan/program; Chapter GPA calculations
- **Leadership Development:** List of member involvement in student organizations, including officer positions held; List of leadership program attendance by members; Member education program outline
- Service and Citizenship: List of chapter service/philanthropy accomplishments; Outlines for service reflection exercises
- Meaningful Relationships: Documentation of partnerships with other chapters; Risk management education programming; List of involvement in campus/community diversity initiatives
- Ritual and Values: Outlines for ritual education exercises; Organizational procedures for accountability
