<u>Visa</u>

AS a U.S. passport holder, you will be allowed to enter Taiwan without a visa for up to 90 days. Your U.S. passport must be valid throughout your intended length of stay and you must have a confirmed return or onward air ticket.

Information for non-U.S. citizens

Packing

Please remember to bring the following items with you.

- 1. Textbooks and study materials
- 2. Your UH student ID
- 3. Your Culture Insurance Services International (CISI) Card (as Health Insurance)
- 4. First Aid Kit----Band-aids, Imodium AD, Neosporin, Tylenol, pills for diarrhea and cough. If you are taking any medication (like for allergies, asthma, or other kind), please take plenty supply for the trip. Please consult your doctor if you have serious medical condition that prevents you from travel.
- 5. Take some vitamin D, C, Zinc for a strong immune to avoid getting sick(suggestion).
- 6. Your passport or green card (also make a copy of photo page)
- 7. Toiletry and shower towels.

Please pack as light as possible. Carry what is essential for you. Heat, humidity, and shower are three words that completely describe summer in Taiwan. Average summer temperature is about 95 F and 92% in humidity.

Regulations in Taiwan:

- 1. This program integrates culture activities into academic courses. Students must take minimum one course.
- 2. Students may not travel by themselves and/or be away from the host campus for more than 16 hours. Please see the Contract.
- 3. Please be on time for classes and all the activities organized by the program. Your absence and tardiness in classes and trips will affect your overall course grades. Departures for trips and activities will be punctual. If you do not appear on time, we assume that you choose not to go.
- 4. Students must comply with rules and regulations of the Host University and hotels. A deposit is required from each student for the dormitory room. It will be refunded upon checking out if nothing is damaged in the room.
- 5. Students must buy the CISI.

- 6. Students must submit a copy of their passport (first page) to Learning Abroad via your study abroad account.
- 7. Late fees will be charged if the application or the program cost payment is late.
- 8. The program fee is nonrefundable after 5/22/2023
- 9. Students must sign the Contract stating they will comply with the rules above at the orientation before the trip.

Please do not believe that you will automatically receive grades of As and Bs by studying in Taiwan. You must earn these grades.

Chung Yuan Christian University (**CYCU**; Chinese: 中原大學) is a private university in <u>Zhongli</u> <u>District</u>, <u>Taoyuan City</u>, <u>Taiwan</u>. The university was established as **Chung Yuan Christian College of Science and Engineering** in 1955 by a group of Taiwanese and American Christian educators to train science and engineering talent in the Christian spirit. The school was upgraded to a full university and renamed Chung Yuan Christian University in 1980. CYCU is a Member of United Board.

Room, Board, Banking and communication

Students will stay in the Foreign Student Dormitory on campus and in a hotel when traveling. Four students share one room. Each room is equipped with bed, mattress, pillow, quilt and sheets. There is a bathroom and shower room on each floor. There is a kitchen with refrigerator, also washing machine (\$0.4 per load) and dryer (\$0.65 per load). The rooms are air conditioned.

Breakfast is included on campus; all meals are provided during the 3 days tour. There are many cafeterias and restaurants around the campus. Grocery stores are easily accessible for fresh fruit and daily necessities. There is a Starbucks on campus.

Banks are available on campus and around campus. You can exchange money in the bank. Most of the stores and markets accept NT \$ only. There is a ATM of the Mega Bank (兆豐銀行)on campus, the Mega Bank also has a branch a counter on campus opens weekdays between 12 to 3pm.

You need take your own cell phone with you, please make sure to unlock your phone code in order to use it in Taiwan. Taiwan is 13 hours ahead of Houston in summer. So, the best time that your family calls you is 8:00am to 10:00am in Houston time which is 9:00pm to 11:00pm in Taiwan. Make sure your phone date plan(rate) for international calls.

Wifi on campus is not free, you need to rent a router to use their Wifi, or buy a SIM card at the Taiwan Airport (about \$35 for a month) to use a free Wifi. We are not sure if your phone plan has unlimited data in the US, you can use it or not. You need to call your own phone company to fid out the international call rate. We need to search more information about get on internet in Taiwan.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who are eligible to participate?

All UH students with 2.0 GPA and above or they must adhere to GPA waiver process. No student with below a 2.0 may participate in a Learning Abroad Program.

Can a student apply if don't have Chinese language knowledge?

Yes. Our program offers none-Chinese Languages course. These students can sign up for Chinese Culture courses which are taught in English. CHIN 3350 and CHIN 3352.

Will participate Study Aboard program speed up graduation?

Yes. By enroll to this one-month class in Taiwan (4 hours class per day) equals the same content hours for a whole year on UH campus. For example, if a student finish Chinese 1501, 1502 by spring 2023, the student will enroll to CHIN 2311, 2312 in summer 2023. The student can enroll to CHIN 3301 in fall 2023.

When to apply: we start to accept application from November, 2022 to February 9th 2023

Where to submit application: hard copy to Jing Zhang's mailbox at MCL main office, AH or e-version to jzhang5@uh.edu

When to pay the \$50 application fee and the \$1650 program fee: We will notify you after the department send bill to your UH account in spring 2023.

Do we need to apply to CYCU? No, you only need to enroll to our study abroad program.

What class should I enroll? If you finish CHIN 1502 in spring, you can enroll to CHIN 2311, 2312. If you finish CHIN 2312 in spring, you can enroll to CHIN 3301, 3302. If you finish CHIN 3302 in spring, you can enroll to CHIN 4301,4302. If you haven't taken any Chinese courses, or if you have finished all Chinese language courses, you can enroll to CHIN 3350, 3352(taught in English).

Does the Program Cost include tuition for the classes?

The tuition and fees from the host university are covered. So do 1 on 2 tutoring. **UH tuition and fees are not covered.** UH will send a bill to you after we register for the courses you wish to take in the study abroad program.

What is the \$1650 program fee including?

- Housing in hotel and foreign student dorm for 4 weeks
- 3 days tour in Eastern Taiwan
- Meals in the 3 days trip and every breakfasts while on campus
- Taiwan domestic travel expenses (round trip transportation from/to airport, bus to Eastern Taiwan trip.)
- Admission tickets for historical and culture sites, parks, and museums

Food in Taiwan

Food in Taiwan is inexpensive. There are many convenient meal options available for foreign students. Because CYCU located in downtown Zhongli. The famous Zhongyuan Night Market is

next to the school. There are many vendors, restaurants, and convenience stores which provide enough variety and selection both for local and foreign students.

Do I have to sign the contract of Agreement and Medical Release Form?

Yes. It is required. You must do so and return it to the Chinese Program.

What recreational activities and sports facilities are available in or near CYCU?

Chung Yuan Christian University equipped with a gym, a swimming pool, a library and other facilities for students. You can also go shopping in the Zhongyuan Night Market next to the school which has many clothing stores and corner shops. If you need to satisfy any daily necessities, there are three supermarkets nearby: RT-Mart, Carrefour, and PX-Mart. Besides, you can take a bus to Zhongli station where you can find all kinds of shops including many exotic and distinct restaurants.

In addition, you can walk about ten minutes from Zhongli train station to the SOGO Department Store. You can also take the train to Taoyuan Station which has several department stores nearby.

Do we travel together to Taiwan? Do we buy air ticket together?

We plan to buy air ticket together to receive group discount, and we travel together to Taiwan and come back to Houston. If a student wants to use mileage to buy air ticket also wants to travel with the group, please contact us for the group travel itinerary.

Arrangements to and from Houston Airport

You need to make arrangements to and from airport by yourself. We will all meet at the airport before boarding the airplane!

Arrangements to and from the Host University to TaoYuan Airport, Taiwan

The host University will pick up and take the group to the Airport.

How long does it take to get to CYCU from Taoyuan International Airport?

It takes about 40 minutes from Taoyuan International Airport to Chung Yuan Christian University.

Tours and Excursions

Historical Sites

Aside from the educational and academic value of the program, we organize tours for students to visit several cities, historical sites, parks, and museums during the program.

Taipei (台北)

A city where gleaming modernity and ancient culture meet. Taipei, the capital of Taiwan, is a modern metropolis with Japanese colonial lanes, busy shopping streets and contemporary buildings. The skyline is crowned by the 509m-tall, bamboo-shaped Taipei 101 skyscraper, with upscale shops at the base and a rapid elevator to an observatory near the top. Taipei is also known for its lively street-food scene and many night markets, We will spend a day in Taipei.



There are many cities that are not so far from CYCU, students can make a day trip during the free weekends. Those cities are: Yilan (宜兰), Taichung(台中), Hualien(花莲), Hsinchu(新竹) and more.

3 days tour to Eastern Taiwan

The Taroko National Park(太鲁阁国家公园)

Taroko National Park is located northeast of the midpoint in the island nation of Taiwan, and southeast from the capital city of Taipei. The national park area covers an area of 360 square miles. The park derived its name from the gorge created by the Liwu River. It is one of the main appeals of the national

park. The river has carved through the marble mountain establishing a stunning gorge worthy of exploration and viewing. Taroko features a collection of natural and man-made facets that make a visit to this national park appropriate for everyone.



Tunnel of Nine Turns(九曲洞)

The Tunnel of nine Turns carved into the side of Taroko Gorge. It is some 800 yards long. A walk through and return will take around 30 minutes at moderate pace. The Trail is one of the best places to observe

Taroko Gorge.



Liyu (carp) Lake (花蓮鯉魚潭)

A charming lake hidden up in the mountains of East Rift Valley of Hualien County, Liyu Lake is a great place for water activities such as sailing as well as cycling and enjoying the scenery.



Hualien Creative and Culture Industries Park

Hualien cultural and creative industries park is located in the center of Hualien city. The historic settlements build in 100 years ago have 3.3 hectares, including 26 old factory warehouses.
