Jane Hathaway, PhD (Princeton) is a Professor of History at The Ohio State University. One of the leading Ottoman historians in the United States, she is the author of *The Politics of Households in Ottoman Egypt* (Cambridge University Press, 2002); *A Tale of Two Factions: Myth, Memory, and Identity* (SUNY Press, 2003), which won the Ohio Academy of History Publication Award; *Beshir Agha: Chief Eunuch of the Ottoman Imperial Harem* (Oneworld, 2006); and *The Arab Lands Under Ottoman Rule, 1516-1800* (Pearson Longman, 2008), which won the Turkish Studies Association's M. Fuat Koprulu Book Prize. She is the editor of four scholarly volumes on various aspects of Ottoman history.
