Dr. Nadera Shalhoub-Kevorkian is a Palestinian Jerusalemite feminist whose scholarship on the settler colonial state's brutality, unchilding, securitized and sacralized politics, state crime, law and society, and global feminist politics, challenges epistemic violence. She is a Professor Extraordinarius at the University of South Africa, the Global Chair in Law at Queen Mary University of London, and a visiting Professor at Princeton University. She is the author of numerous books, among them *Militarization and Violence Against Women in Conflict Zones in the Middle East: The Palestinian Case Study*" (Cambridge University Press, 2010; *Security Theology, Surveillance and the Politics of Fear* (Cambridge University Press 2015); and *Incarcerated Childhood and the Politics of Unchilding* (Cambridge University Press 2019). She has co-edited volumes such as *When Politics are Sacralized: Comparative Perspectives on Religious Claims and Nationalism* (Cambridge University Press 2021); and *The Cunning of Gender Violence* (Duke University Press 2023).
