His work spans topics such as Hollywood, jazz, boxing, African liberation, the Haitian, Cuban, Mexican, and Brazilian revolutions, Caribbean independence, and the Pacific War—many translated internationally. His 2026 book, *The Counter-Revolution of 1893*, completes a trilogy with *The Counter-Revolution of 1776 and 1836*. Honors include the 2023 Frantz Fanon Lifetime Achievement Award, 2021 American Book Award for *The Dawning of the Apocalypse*, and lifetime achievement awards from Black Studies and African American history associations. A member of the Texas Institute of Letters (2024), he also received the Hope Stevens Award for his legal work.
