The Program in Jewish Studies at Rice University in Houston and the Religious Studies Program at the University of Houston are organizing an international, interdisciplinary, and interdenominational conference in cooperation with the Universität des Saarlandes, Saarbrücken (Germany) and the Universität Rostock (Germany) and in collaboration with the Lanier Theological Library in Houston.

The theme of the conference is “B̄rit, Diatheke, Foedus, Covenant, Bund” (the topic of “covenant” in five different languages, among them Biblical Hebrew and Greek). The conference convenes 20 national and international scholars who explore the origins, development, and later reception of a central theological theme that permeates most parts of the Bible. This academic event is for scholars, clergy, students of religion, and all who want to learn more about the Bible.
