What is DLD?

Developmental Language Disorder or DLD is a difference in brain development that affects a person's ability to understand others and to communicate their ideas in conversation. DLD tends to be hidden, sometimes misdiagnosed as negative behavior or inattention.

What is Developmental Language Disorder?

- DLD is hidden, but often affects 1 out of 14 students in a classroom.
- DLD can affect communication throughout the lifespan.
- DLD can impact social relationships and emotional well-being.
- DLD is associated with risks for literacy and/or learning disorders.
- DLD has no known cause, but it may run in families.



Services for Developmental Language Disorder at the USLHC

• Diagnostic evaluations and individual therapy services are offered at the University Speech-Language-Hearing Clinic (USLHC) at the University of Houston main campus.

• All services are provided by graduate students in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders under the supervision of a licensed and certified speech-language pathologist.





Possible Signs Of DLD

People with DLD might...

- have difficulty remembering the words they want to say.
- retell stories without a clear beginning, middle, and end.
- add fewer details when giving an explanation.
- find it hard to understand jokes and figurative language.
- have difficulty with reading and writing tasks.
