Ben-Dror Yemini was born in Tel-Aviv, Israel. He studied Humanities and History at Tel Aviv University where he earned his law degree. Soon after, he was appointed as the advisor to the Israeli Minister of Immigration Absorption and then became spokesman of the Ministry.

After his term in the public service, Yemini began his career as a journalist and essayist. In 1986, Yemini published the book "Political Punch", which takes a critical view of politics and society in Israel. In 2003 he became the opinion-editor of the daily newspaper Maariv and published many articles and essays in other journals.

He has published a series of research articles about the Israeli-Arab conflict in which he examined genocide, refugees, human rights violations, the status of Israeli Arabs, multiculturalism, and women.
