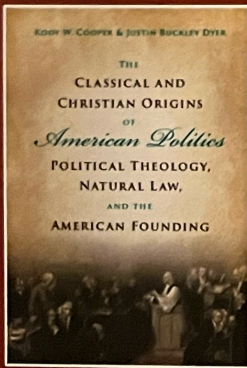

Justin Dyer is the executive director of the Civitas Institute, professor of government, and Jack G. Taylor Regents Professor at The University of Texas at Austin. Prior to his position at UT-Austin, he taught for 13 years at the University of Missouri, where he was the founding director of the Kinder Institute on Constitutional Democracy.

Dyer writes and teaches in the fields of American political thought, jurisprudence and constitutionalism, with an emphasis on the perennial philosophical tradition of natural law. He is the author or editor of eight books and numerous articles, essays and book reviews. His most recent book, with Kody Cooper, is *The Classical and Christian Origins of American Politics: Political Theology, Natural Law, and the American Founding* (forthcoming from Cambridge University Press).
