BY NOVEMBER 18 all oral presentations must have been completed. A student may request to do the presentation in the Instructor's office.
- (4) Academic dishonesty as defined by the UH Student and Faculty Handbooks will result in an F for the course. All sources and quotes must be documented as to the author and name of the source.
- (5) Students needing reasonable accommodations due to a physical or mental disability, talk to the Instructor in private as soon as possible.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of this semester, students should be at the MIDDLE ADVANCED PROFICIENCY LEVEL. They should be able to narrate in and talk about the present, past, and future, and express likes

and dislikes. Students will continue to learn how to hypothesize.

Students are expected to learn basic functional Spanish phonology for effective oral communication. They are expected to learn how to plan, organize, and make effective oral presentation. The course is designed to enable students to increase their vocabulary and to develop self confidence in speaking the target language. Students will also be given many exercises to improve their grammar.
