This course will focus upon intersections of race and sexuality. The readings draw from interdisciplinary perspectives, but primarily anthropology, critical race studies, sociology, and intersectional feminist theory. We will read work from critical race theorists and sociologists about how racism is embedded in institutions. We will read ethnographic research by anthropologists and sociologists to understand how racial meanings emerge in everyday life. We will also look at examples from contemporary art, performance art, and popular culture to see how racialized sexuality has been challenged as a racist instrument as well as used as a tool of resistance.
