

Assessment of Learning in Student Affairs: A Comprehensive Division-Wide Plan

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Learning Outcomes

- An **outcome** is the desired effect of a program, service, or intervention but is more specific than a goal. *It is participant centered.* (Upcraft & Schuh, 1996)

Types of Learning Outcomes

- Student learning outcomes: cognitive or affective abilities/characteristics demonstrated
- Program outcomes: what your program accomplishes
- Operational outcomes: metrics regarding how well the operation works (financial metrics)

Domains of STUDENT Learning Outcomes

- Cognitive (knowledge/thinking/mental skills)
- Affective (attitudes/feelings/emotions)
- Psychomotor (skills/doing/physical skills)

Example of words from Bloom's Taxonomy (Bloom, 1956)

- **Knowledge**: identifies, defines, describes
- **Understanding**: explains, summarizes, classifies
- **Application**: demonstrates, computes, solves
- **Analysis**: differentiates, diagrams, estimates
- **Synthesis**: creates, formulates, revises
- **Evaluation**: criticizes, compares, concludes

Writing Learning Outcomes

- Learning outcome = **SWiBAT** + **Bloom Word** + **Condition**
 - Example: **Students Will Be Able To understand healthy lifestyle choices *as a result of participating in outreach activities sponsored by CAPS* (PUL 2).**

Determination of Measures

- Indirect: reflection on an experience
- Direct: actual observed experience

Basic Rules of Data Collection

- Resist the temptation to assess every aspect of everything you do!
- Focus on finding meaningful results that you can use to share your story
- Keep reminding your colleagues about this process throughout the year 😊

Closing the loop: Communicate with students intentionally

- Provide them with prompts to reflect on their learning
- Help them make any connections between your programs/services/activities and their classes

Closing the loop: Use data for improvement

- Focus on development of programs, services, and activities to foster co-curricular learning
- Richer discussions with academic partners
