

APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID

1. Graduate students create a FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov
2. Complete the FAFSA application studentaid.gov
 - Opens in December 2023 for the 2025 academic year.
 - For the 2024-2025 Academic Year, use 2022 income information
 - Transfer your income onto your FAFSA with the tool presented
 - **Priority deadline for financial aid is March 15, 2024**
3. Graduate students should review the Student Aid Report (SAR), the resulting output document for the student.
4. All graduate students are considered independent students for financial aid purposes
5. Students must provide any requested documentation to the school in a timely manner

Frequently Asked Questions

- Time to degree? Typically 2 ½ - 3 yrs.
- Transfer in credits? Maximum of 9 hours allowable.
- Mode of instruction is a mixture of face-to-face, hybrid, and online synchronous.
