Approval of Minutes: December 11, 2024 Meeting

The minutes of the December 11, 2024 meeting were approved as distributed.

Report from and Discussion with the University of Houston System Senior Vice Chancellor and University of Houston Senior Vice President for Administration and Finance: Raymond Bartlett

- Safety & Security Update:
 - SVP Bartlett's team is working with Student Affairs for outreach to the victims of the three security incidents. Planning to bring additional resources to campus. There will be an additional email regarding campus security coming out shortly.
 - There is progress in the three security cases.
 - UHPD was asked to review and assess the 3000 security cameras (i.e., new cameras needed?, need more cameras? cameras placed in the appropriate areas?)
 - Review lighting in parking lots and garages
 - SVP Bartlett emphasized the safety and security of the UH community is his number one priority.

Q&A session followed with questions about live recording capabilities, statistics on perpetrators, security in the Health District (walking to garages), use of security cameras on robots, and broader communication on security measures.

SVP Raymond Bartlett emphasized to everyone to be aware of their surroundings. "If you see something, say something."

Report from and Discussion with the University of Houston System Vice Chancellor and University of Houston Vice President for Research: Claudia Neuhauser

- VP Claudia Neuhauser asked the senators to pace themselves with the many federal changes that are ongoing. The Division of Research (DoR) has a website of the ongoing changes: updates are made daily. She encouraged faculty to see how graduate students will be impacted by the changes, etc. Dr. Neuhauser invited faculty to let DoR know their concerns via the website (https://uh.edu/research/resources/federal-updates/#FAQ)
- NIH funding opportunities: The federal government is looking through the fifty-six-page PDF
 of funding opportunities to see if there are any DEI components, etc. included). There will
 probably be terminations across federal agencies. Regarding No Cost extensions on an NIH
 grant, faculty needs to double-check with the agencies before requesting one.
- Research security hasn't been halted. Faculty need to register for required training through CITI. Business travel isn't allowed to foreign adversary countries.

 Core Facilities: BoR Meeting next week: Will request approval for funding for a piece of core facilities equipment that costs over \$1M.

Q&A session followed with concerns about IDC rates, NSF grants, and UH administration's plans with ongoing changes.

UH Athletics Update by University of Houston Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics: <u>Eddie Nuñez</u>

VP Eddie Nuñez introduced himself and gave a brief overview of his background. Eddie Nuñez informed the Faculty Senate on what he has been doing during the five months he has been at UH thus far.

- Learning about UH and finding opportunities to get student-athletes involved with campus life (major Athletics initiative).
- Selling the vision of UH Athletics. Will know more about the House Settlement in May 2025.
- Building new partnerships and opening doors with industry to help student-athletes with professional development.
- Traveled to Austin to talk to legislators to elevate UH as a whole (not just the studentathletes).
- Athletics Budget: signed several partnerships to elevate UH Athletics and its budget.

Q&A session followed on concerns about current deficit to cove subsidies (maximizing opportunities to raise funding), rescinding of NIL and other sports besides football/basketball, and student-athlete compensation.

Athletics Academic Team members introduced themselves (Angel Shamblin-Price, Shawn Buckner). Angel mentioned that athletes had to keep up academically along with their athletic endeavors. She spoke about the different strategies to keep athletes on track & decrease the drop rate (i.e., tutor, etc.)

Sen. Seth Chandler asked if the Faculty Senate or any committee consulted about the Return to Work Policy change. FS Pres. Love responded that FS leadership was informed and was asked to anticipate the reaction/impact across campus regarding the AWA policy being rescinded. She mentioned that UH President Khator had thought about this issue for quite a while and had mentioned it during meetings with Senate leadership. Faculty Senate leadership is asking for clarification and guidance and continues to keep in touch with the administration.
