Completion of the bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 credit hours of course work and a minimum of 1,000 clock hours of work experience in the hospitality industry (GHL 2160 = 300 internship hours, GHL 4360 = 700 work hours).

INTERNSHIPS

- If you currently hold a supervisory position within an organization, these hours can be used in place of an internship.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

• It is recommended that you complete your work hours the semester before you enroll in the course.

ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTATION

- · Copy of pay stubs showing hours worked.
- · Copy of letter from your employer indicating position held, dates and total number of hours worked. You MUST include your employer's contact information.
- The employer must send the form directly to the instructor of record and cannot come from the student.
