PhD Milestones:

- Candidacy Exam: The main objective of the candidacy exam is to assess a PhD student's progress and confirm a student's capability to proceed to the advanced curriculum.
- Committee Composition and Approval: The student selects a dissertation advisor and committee to guide them through the dissertation research and preparation. The naming of a dissertation advisory committee is a requirement for PhD Candidacy.
- Comprehensive Exam: The purpose of the comprehensive exam is to evaluate a PhD student's progress in the academic development process, assess the need for additional coursework, and ensure the readiness to conduct a doctoral dissertation.
- Oral Comprehensive Exam: Upon receiving the results of the written comprehensive exam, the oral comprehensive exam is scheduled within the next two weeks.
- Dissertation Proposal Approval: The PhD candidate is required to develop and propose an original research plan to the supervisory committee.
- Dissertation Defense: The student presents and defends the dissertation in a public lecture to be followed by committee only.
