Alexander W. Obregon is the Special Projects Coordinator in the Executive Division of the Office of the Houston City Controller, which superintends the fiscal affairs of the City. Alexander began his tenure with the City when Controller Ronald C. Green assumed office in January 2010.

Alexander currently serves on the Board of Directors for Skills 4 Living, Inc., a Houston area non-profit agency dedicated to promoting financial education.
