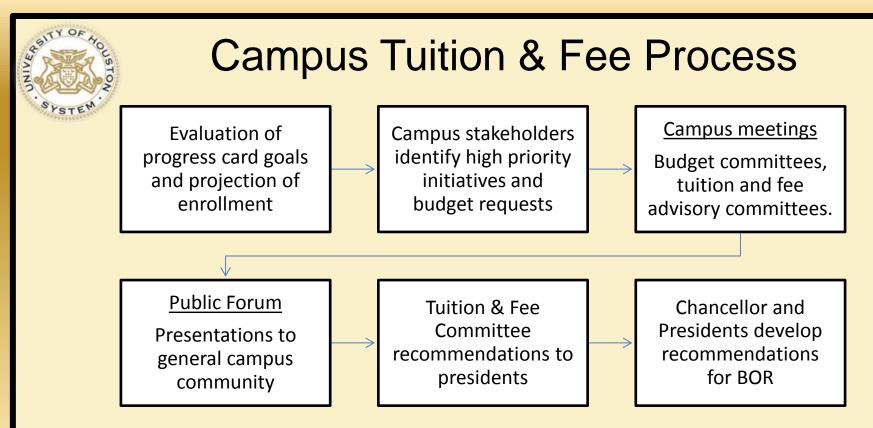

# Section 1 – F&A-C

### Establish FY2015 and FY2016 4-Year Fixed Tuition

### House Bill 29

Universities shall offer entering undergraduate students a fixed tuition price plan:

- To begin Fall 2014, may be optional,
- For at least the first 12 consecutive semesters (four academic years),
- Includes undergraduate students who transfer to the institution,
- Subject to restrictions or qualifications adopted by the governing board.

### **Reasons to Encourage 15 Hours/Semester \***

- Taking only 12 credits per term can add a year to a four-year degree.
- Students, parents, and public financial aid programs pay more for more semesters.
- Students lose out on a year or more of employment and income.
- Fewer students can be served with limited capacity—advising, parking, dormitories.
- Dropout rates are higher for students who take fewer credits.

# **4-Year Fixed Tuition Rates**

- This is an optional program
- The FY2015 rates will apply to the Fall 2014 cohort of first time in college (FTIC) freshmen plus undergraduate transfer students entering in Fall 2014
- The FY2016 rates will apply to the Fall 2015 cohort of first time in college (FTIC) freshmen plus undergraduate transfer students entering in Fall 2015
- The FY2015 rates are developed under the assumption that variable-rate tuition will escalate at an inflation rate of 2.2% over the next four years.
- Non-resident premiums will be charged in addition to the rates below
- Student Based Fees will be in addition to the amounts below

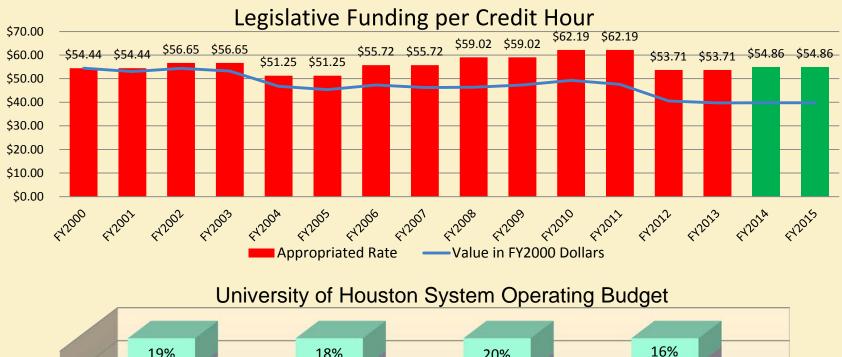

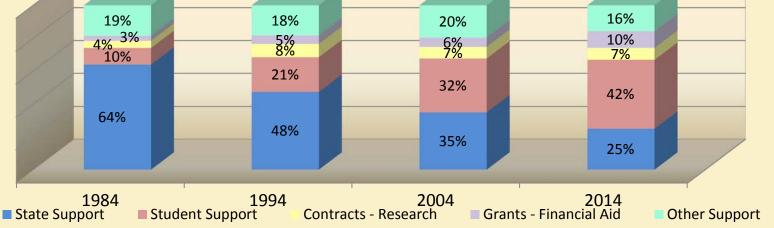

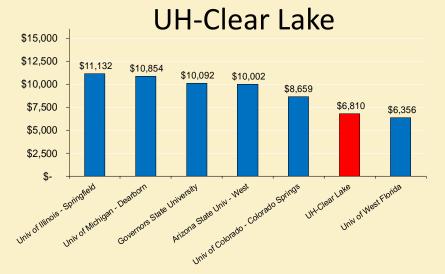
### FY2014 Tuition and Fees **30 Credit Hour Academic Year for Undergraduates**

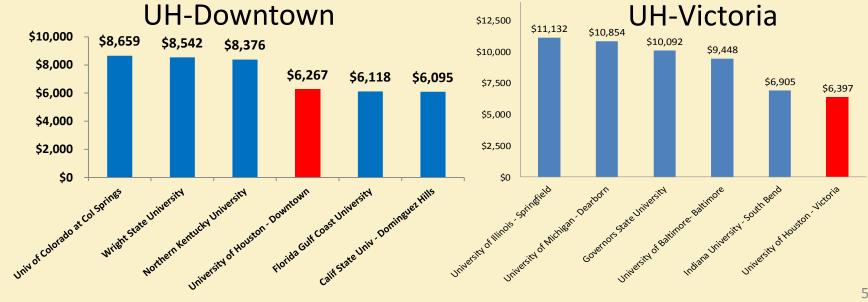

# **University of Houston – Victoria** FY2015 and FY2016 Student Service Fee

### FY2015

- Increase the hourly rate from \$31 to \$35 and the maximum rate from \$191 to \$210 per semester.
- The revenue will provide additional support for campus safety, student retention efforts, student services to the centers and on-line, and student transportation.

### <u>FY2016</u>

- Increase the hourly rate from \$35 to \$38.50 and the maximum rate from \$210 to \$231 per semester
- The revenue will provide additional support for campus safety and student services both face-to-face and on-line.

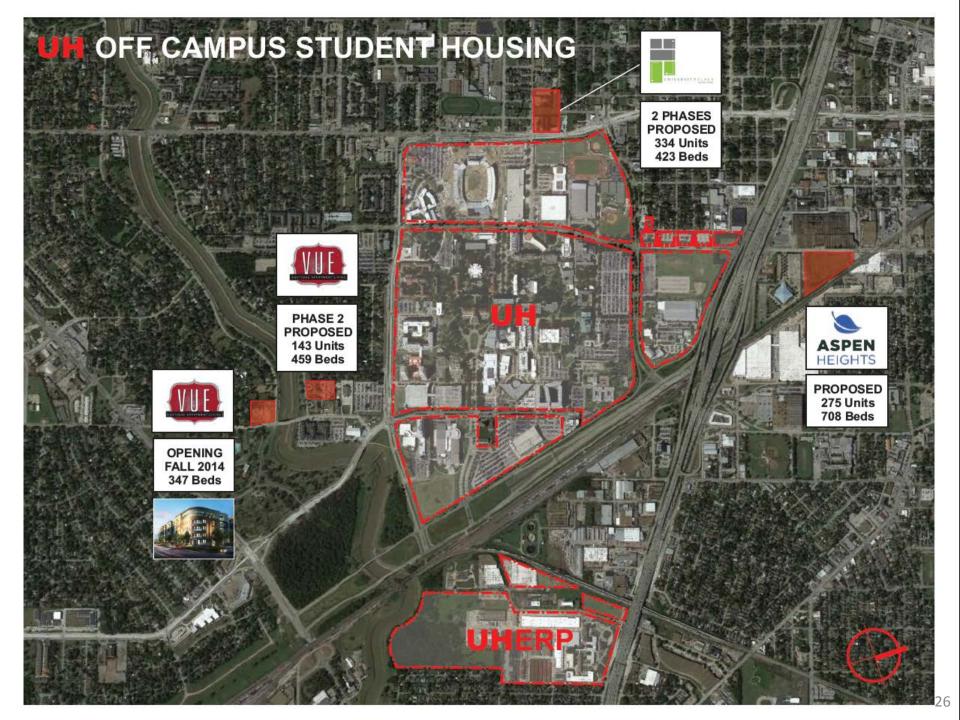

The 4-Year Fixed tuition program is an optional tuition plan for first-time in college (FTIC) freshmen and undergraduate transfer students. The program is a requirement of House Bill 19 from the 83rd Texas Legislature and must be offered starting in the fall 2014 semester.

Revenue generated from the 4-year fixed program will be offset by similar revenue reductions from the standard variable rate tuition plans.

Student recommended mandatory fees will be in addition to the amounts displayed here.

\* The 4-year fixed tuition program is optional and applies only to first-time in college (FTIC) freshmen and transfer undergraduate students. The rates shown are for resident students. Non-residents may also enter the program but will be charged the non-resident premium tuition amounts in addition to rates shown above. The amounts include mandatory academic fees (such as course and college fees, library fees, etc.) but exclude student-recommended mandatory fees (student service fee, recreation and university center fees).

\*\* UH will charge the 15 SCH rate to all students enrolled in the program each fall and spring semester. Students may take additional (or fewer) hours without a change in cost. During the summer terms, students enrolled in the 4-year fixed tuition plan may take courses with only statutory tuition being charged.

\*\*\* UHCL, UHD and UHV will charge a per-credit-hour rate (for both the fall and spring semesters as well as for summer terms) based on the above 15 credit hour rates.
