- **Application goes live July 18<sup>th</sup>**
- Start application process
- Confirm letters of recommendation
- **July 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> PCAT**
- International priority deadline: August 1<sup>st</sup>

Fall \_\_\_\_\_

- **Early Decision Deadline is: September 3<sup>rd</sup>**
- Finish your application and submitting items
- **September 10<sup>th</sup> PCAT**
- **October 21<sup>st</sup>- November 1<sup>st</sup>**
- Onsite interviews begin
- Final Deadline is: January 6<sup>th</sup>
