



Governor Abbott particularly urges Texas colleges and universities to focus on recruiting nationally and internationally recognized researchers in fields of science, technology, engineering and math.










Fall Undergraduate Enrollment




Average SAT on the Rise









Average Annual Cost




Students Who Return After Their First Year


