



MATH ALIGNMENT



- Ensures students complete gateway math requirements for their major
- Facilitates successful transfer from community colleges to four-year institutions

BUSINESS DEGREE MAP

FULL TRANSFER

All credits in the major at two-year institutions transfer as 60 hours toward the corresponding major at four-year institutions.

POST-TRANSFER

After transfer, **60 hours remain** to complete a degree in a corresponding major with **manageable course sequencing** over 2 years at the four-year institutions.




