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

# **GRANT PROCESS**

### **Due Dates**

- Preproposals for Summer
  2024 programs are due by
  November 10.
- Proposals for Summer 2023
   programs are due by
   December 18.



### **Grant Process**

#### Preproposal

- CITE Director Review
- Invite proposal.
- Revise and resubmit.
- Reject.

#### Proposal

- CITE Advisory Board Review
- Recommend for funding.
- Revise and resubmit.
- Reject.
- Prioritize funding recommendations.

#### Final review

• Provost Chase makes final funding decisions.

## Preproposals



- Require less information on budget and assessment.
- Provide an early opportunity to get feedback.
- All preproposal authors meet with the CITE Director.
- Form is linked <u>here</u>.



- Require two rubrics for evaluating assignments for two <u>Student Learning</u> <u>Outcomes</u>.
- Include detailed budget.
- Respond to any issues raised in the preproposal discussion.
- Form is linked <u>here</u>.



## **Grant Budgets**

- Grant budgets have ranged from \$2,000 to \$60,000.
- Higher cost grants included substantial financial assistance for students.
- Faculty stipends up to \$5,500 (inclusive of fringe) can be awarded, but budget narrative must include a justification.

### **Students will:**

- Develop the **cultural competency** necessary to interact effectively with people of diverse cultures and viewpoints through self-awareness, openness to experience, and knowledge of cultural practices and worldviews.
- Develop the **social responsibility** necessary to engage regional, national, and global communities through intercultural competence and civic responsibility.
- Think about how different perspectives might apply in **ethical decision making** by assessing their own values, recognizing ethical issues, and considering the ramifications of alternative actions.

## **Faculty Evaluation of Students**

Rubrics for two of the Student Learning Outcomes included in proposals. Rubrics may be revised. Consult the CITE Office if assistance is needed.

Program leaders use rubrics to evaluate at least two assignments.



- Quantitative and qualitative questions.
- Students reflect on goals and expectations.
