

FY18 Total Research Expenditures - NSF






Total Research Expenditures – External Sources




Total Funds Requested






Total Amount Commitment Received in FY






FY18 Research Expenditures - Sources






FY18 Research Awards - Sources








Average Funding Request >\$1M








Number of Proposals Submitted >\$1M






Total Funding Requests \$250k-\$999k






Average Funding Request \$250k-\$999k






Number and Value of New Awards Funded >\$1M





Average Value of New Awards >\$1M






Number and Value of New Awards Funded <\$250k

FY16-18 College Research Expenditures






FY18 College Research Expenditures








FY17 College Research Expenditures Per Ranked Faculty >100k






FY18 College Research Expenditures Per Ranked Faculty <100k







FY18 Department Research Expenditures – Top 20






FY18 Department Research Expenditures – Top 20






FY18 Department Research Expenditures – Top 10






FY18 Department Research Expenditures per Ranked Faculty







Research Expenditures Per Faculty Rank - Overall













Scholarly Contributions
