The Center for Student Involvement respectfully submits two (2) requests for FY2019 One Time Allocation Requests to enhance programs and services. The requests for funding are as follows:

#### FY2019 One Time Allocation Request #1 – ServeUH Initiatives

For the third consecutive year, the University of Houston was selected as a NASPA Lead Initiative Institution, a prestigious designation that was granted to less than 100 institutions across the country this year. The Center for Student Involvement, in line with institutional and divisional priorities, is dedicated to providing high quality civic engagement opportunities for students that positively impact the Houston community. Through ServeUH initiatives, our students will gain a deeper understanding of the community, the social issues that impact Houston, and how they can make a difference.

#### The goals of ServeUH are:

- To provide a broader range of experiences for students allowing us to empower students to become active, global citizens who lead with a lifelong commitment to service.
- To further the development of signature programs focused on addressing social issue education and civil discourse (Hunger Banquet, End It, etc.).
- To continue expanding our tracking of volunteer service hours to support more students earning the President's Volunteer Service Award.

In FY16, students logged a total of 522 volunteer hours in Get Involved. At the end of FY18, this number had increased to 15,605 hours, valued at an economic impact of \$376,704.70 according to the value of volunteer time from the Independent Sector. Supporting ServeUH initiatives not only contributes to student success, but it also contributes to the local community in a positive way. In the weeks following Hurricane Harvey, many students, faculty, staff, and community members turned to CSI for information about how to support others or where to find assistance. With the support of the UH community, we collected and distributed over 5,000 items to UH students, faculty, and staff in need. The ServeUH initiatives are intended to provide that level of support to the campus and community throughout every year, not just in the wake of disaster.

Throughout FY18, the ServeUH area interacted and collaborated with 31 unique entities including departments in the Division of Student Affairs and Enrollment Services, academic departments, community organizations, registered student organizations, and other institutions throughout the state of Texas. As ServeUH continues to develop, we will look to both deepen existing partnerships and develop new partnerships across campus and in the local community. This commitment to collaboration will allow us to be better stewards of any funding we receive from SFAC, while also contributing to a more comprehensive experience for the students.
