- 4 NCAA Individual National titles
- Men's Track \& Field placed $3^{\text {rd }}$ in the NCAA Championship, its first podium since 1959.
- Men's Basketball secured its $1^{\text {st }}$ NCAA tournament win since 1984
- Football made its $5^{\text {th }}$ straight bowl appearance.
- 13 of 17 Teams represented in NCAA post-season.
- 11 Teams posted a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA.
- 32 American Conference individual or relay champions.
- Ed Oliver becomes the $1^{\text {st }}$ underclassmen to win the prestigious Outland Trophy
