



ON CAMPUS CAREER FAIR UPDATES LEARNING OUTCOMES

77.8% gained knowledge of a new opportunity

56.2% gained a connection/job lead

50.4% gained practice marketing themselves to employers







VIRTUAL CHAT

- 123 students used virtual chat since its launch on June 4th
 - 16 students responded to the survey
 - 94% stated it was their **first time** using University Career Services
 - 42% used virtual chat because it was convenient, while
 - 26% were a commuter
 - 100% would recommend this service to other students


