In higher education, we are at a critical point in the national conversation around DACA/undocumented where universities are dedicating ample amount of human and financial resources to educate the campus about this underserved population. The University of Houston is no exception, with a rather substantial population, UEP has been designated as one of the primary offices to support UH Dreamers by the DSAES Vice President's office.
