

FY2023 One-Time Request #1 – SPB Cinema Programming

The Student Program Board requests \$15,900.00 to support Cinema programming throughout FY2023. Due to the variety of different movie genres available and the high number of attendees at cinema events, SPB Cinema has consistently been one of our most popular programming committees. In the past year, we were successfully able to host 13 cinema events, with over 600 students in attendance throughout the year. Though these numbers are lower than they have been in years past, they are congruent with the overall decrease in the on-campus population during FY21. As we return to an in-person campus environment and strengthen our cinema programming, we find a higher demand for a greater variety of movies throughout the year. We have been able to program previous events thanks to our collaborators such as, Black Student Union, Student Housing and Residential Life, and Frontier Fiesta and hope to increase this list moving forward.

FY2023 One-Time Request #2 – SPB Homecoming Concert Funding

The Student Program Board requests \$84,800.00 in funding for a smaller-scale Homecoming Concert to be held on campus. Funding will cover the performer fee, middle agent fee, lodging, ground transportation, hospitality, security, venue staffing, and marketing for the concert. SPB wishes to collaborate with the Homecoming Board to host concerts for students, staff, and alumni. The 2020 Homecoming Concert was virtual and featured hip-hop artist Lucky Daye. The total cost of the concert was \$24,310.00 and 120 UH students logged on to the virtual event. Because of the virtual nature of the program, performance fees across the industry were lower than typical rates and goods and services for an in-person concert such as production, backline, security, travel, catering, and other items associated with an in-person concert were not expended during FY21. Students were also given the unique opportunity to have a meet and greet with the Rapper. SPB would like to continue to collaborate with the Homecoming Board to create an atmosphere that students can enjoy during this tradition here at the University of Houston. The Student Program Board believes due to the concert being virtual and during the ongoing Covid-19 Pandemic, this caused a major reduction in the number of students that attended the virtual concert. For reference, in FY20, the Homecoming concert cost \$37,975.00 and garnered an attendance of 1,213. We are asking to increase the budget to \$60,000 specifically for the artist as this would open the door to artists with an increased popularity and following, therefore encouraging more students to attend the event.

As a point of reference, some notable artists that would be considered bringing to campus along with current quotes are Kali Uchis at \$150,000, 6LACK at \$75-\$125k, and Jaden Smith at \$75-125k. Additionally, with these higher level artist come additional expenses such as increased production costs and higher levels of security.
