- Senator Davis: welcome to another student meeting! I'm just going to get the • report here. So, I was able to create a petition in support of UH having in-person commencement ceremonies. The reason behind this petition is because there was uprising concerns as to why there is in-person games but there's no in-person graduation. So, it seems to be a disconnect there and something I was watching on Twitter and then one of my friends reached out to me and that was like the first action that needed to be taken because you know basically this petition is behind numbers to see communication from administration as to see why there's athletic games in person but not in person graduations. Please, make sure that you support that and hopefully there could be something to follow after that. The March for Africa that I was organizing which was scheduled for November 7th this Saturday at 3:00 PM has been postponed to Saturday November 14th at 3:00 PM. Please, attend if you can. Hopefully, I was able to give you all enough time to come out with the Bing next week. So, please make sure that you do come out if you can. remember this March is to stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters in Africa and spread awareness of the Holocaust, the child trafficking, the police brutality, everything happening in the continent. If you all don't know what intersectionality is, please make sure you do research. It means that whatever no matter where you are it affects you no matter what your race ethnicity, it affects you. Next thing is the improved UH online petition. Senator Ahmed and I was able to meet last week regarding that with Ms. Longacre, vice Provost and Dean of undergraduate student success. We were able to discuss concerns about the petition in depth, which was pretty good that she's able to hear as we would hear her and hopefully policies can be put in place to make changes with that. but what I did notice is that we have to be specific on certain things. So, hopefully depending on what the academic affairs committees, which I'm a part of, says and then we could probably get a bill and then that would be the clarity and specifics that Ms. Longacre needs to make those policies.
- Senator Duvall: Hi everyone! Thank you for voting if you did. if you didn't then hopefully, you'll come by on next election. Aside from that I had the opportunity to go to a conference for artificial intelligence with their graphics cards. Also, I got to go to one of their seminars and learning how to create AI, specifically something called deep learning & in the middle of the classes, it was like an hour class, someone one of their spokespersons came up and said if you have a problem with this please let us know because the last one, they made was a machine that could dynamically find Waldo in any of the "where's Waldo books" which may seem pretty cool but that is very close to facial recognition. So, they stopped teaching it. What I'm trying to get at here is I'm trying to implement something similar at UH still. Either to prevent the misuse of a technology that is that is abnormally powerful because if you have anything in your house that

dynamically knows what you're doing without you putting anything in it is, that is AI. It is everywhere, it's not coming it is already here. and so, in order to responsibly use AI, we have to responsibly regulate it because it is definitely going to be misused. technology this powerful is always misused. So, I'm trying to do something similar at UH. I'm currently drawing out the plans for that but if you would like to know more information on this or have some input go right ahead it's always well to have more than one brain

I. Report of the President

Hey everyone, Good evening thank you so much for coming to another meeting I • know that it's a super anxious time for everyone unfortunately there's elected officials who don't believe in human rights for everyone and in light of the election I've been thinking a lot about what it really means to be an American and thinking a lot about American history you know the United States is a country that was really built on the oppression and exploitation of people from indigenous people to slavery to exploiting immigrants for labor our country's history has not always been beautiful and there's those who are in power who would like us to forget about our history but there's another a really important part of American history that we should take into consideration and that's how we even became a country in the 1st place it was people revolting against an oppressive government and oppressive regime and using their power as people collectively to try to make a difference and try to make a change and that's how we even got this country in the first place so I think that no matter what happens in this election you know make your voice heard you are a citizen and you are somebody who is a value in this country so if you feel like your rights are being exploited in any way if you feel like your rights are being taken away then use your power as an American to go out and protest to go out and make your voice heard I think it's extremely important that we utilized whatever power we have as people and that we utilized that and we put pressure on our elected officials not just during a contentious election but continuously when we see that our politicians aren't there aren't serving us the way that we want them to serve us then we should go out there and make our voices heard so I just wanted to say that in light of everything that's going on in light of the election results. I know everybody is anxiously probably looking at that on Twitter right now or watching it on TV or something but some things that I wanted to talk about that are more SGA related is what's going to happen in the next semester so I know that are semester is coming to an end because of Thanksgiving I want you to know that we are going to move forward and have meetings over the winter break it will be similar to summer Senate and Julian will talk more about that in detail in the coming weeks as we kind of prepare and plan for what's to come for SGA during the winter semester something else that I was able to do is this past Friday I was able to speak at the Democratic rally that was at UH. I just wanted to mention that briefly because it was incredibly amazing experience to see to see Texas become a battleground state that's a truly historic time so it's absolutely amazing that I got to do that I got to be judge Lina Hidalgo I got to meet Sima I got to meet my own congresswoman which was just getting absolutely incredible experience and I did get to see senator Harris as well in person in the flesh and that was just an incredible experience as well and I was just inspired by truly all these very powerful women and what they were what they've been able to accomplish during

a time where there were all socially distancing where we are in a global pandemic an in the most contentious election that I think any of us will probably ever see so it was just really inspiring to see all of these women come out and be united for a righteous cause so some more in SGA related things I had a meeting with a lot of different University administration and we kind of talked about everything that was in the CSD petition and that's in the CSD bill that reflects pretty closely what's in the petition so I just wanted to say that the University administration was extremely willing to work with the students and extremely willing to work with us as an organization they've planned a kind of similar to what the SJ walk in the dark was like except this is geared specifically for students with disabilities so finding like sidewalks or doors that aren't working Accessibility buttons that aren't working seeing where we can add more that's something that we're going to be working on I know that they've released like a working group and a doodle poll for anybody who's interested in that if any of you are interested in coming please reach out to myself sasser or Maddie and I'm sure we'll be able to kind of help you out if you want to participate in something like that and what I loved about the CSD meeting is that it really shows the kind of power that we have as a collective student body as a student government as student government were able to bring things to the university's attention and with all the petitions that we've had this past year were really able to kind of use all this student support and then take this to the table in conversations with administration and they're always really willing to work with us so I thought that was absolutely a great experience in a pretty great when it was something that you know we campaigned for and it's something that we're going to get done and so I'm really proud of everybody who's worked on the petitions the bill and who has been president in those meetings I thought that was extremely great I wanted to give a little bit of an update about next semester in about commencement and graduation I had a meeting with the Provost and doctor long acre recently and in regards to next semester and if it's going to be short and if we're going to spring break it looks like it should be a pretty regular semester that's what I've kind of been told I mean nothing is really finalized until the Provo sends out any valid telling us that everything's been finalized but I will say that it looks like it's going to be a normal semester that we'll have our spring break and will be able to come back from spring break but of course go virtual if anything is to happen when it comes to graduation and commencement I was told that unfortunately because the University is already kind of paid a company to do a virtual commencement for the fall that that's what they're doing that's not to say that we can't stop our advocacy I don't think we should ever stop our advocacy if we really want an in person graduation then we should keep pushing for one but I just wanted to let you all know that that's what they told me when I brought it to their attention however the petition and

everything that Kenneth has been doing we're going to be able to kind of we're going to be able to kind of push to make sure that we have an in person spring graduation and I've been told that that's what they're planning for so that's just to relay that information to y'all some things that we're planning for next semester and this semester should come I know this is kind of long I'm sorry I just want to give us any updates as possible so we are going to we're continuing with the transfer student mentor ship program so that is going to pilot into the spring semester we're also continuing with the international student membership programs to continue for the spring semester as well and hopefully both of those programs will either be taken by taken up by the University we're hoping the Provost office will take over the transfer student mentorship program and that the I triple S office will take over the international student membership program so that's going to continue Julian sent our email to Sergeant this past week about all of the sidewalks and lights that were not that weren't working at night so hopefully facilities were is going to go ahead and take care of that for us something else that I'm really going to push for the spring is that I want to have a kind of weeklong sexual assault awareness event so in that I want to have a panel I've talked to somebody who could be as potential speaker at that panel so hopefully will be able to have a speaker and will have some people be able to maybe share some of their spoken word poetry that sort of thing we're planning a feminine product drive with Chewbacca who is the president of an organization on campus is going to help us out with that as well I also wanted to see look into purchasing there are kind of date raped coasters like there they kind of you can kind of see if your drink has been like spiked with any sort of like date rape drug and it will let you know and so I'm looking into seeing if we were able to purchase some of those so we can give them out at the table links during this event so we can kind of have a PR campaign and have marketing associated with that as well in addition I'm hoping to do a lot more kind of drives to help our community so I've been in touch with a third Ward Community Center to see if we can donate some hygiene products sanitizer mask that sort of thing to the third Ward community so hopefully that's something that we're going to be able to do in the spring semester when things are a little bit more in person because I have been told that they should be a little bit more in person for spring at least that's what administration is hoping for and then in the first week of the spring semester we're going to do a kind of parking food drive so that means that we're going to have parking citation forgiveness up to \$25.00 if you bring a canned food item to the HGA table essentially and so we're going to be highlighting that as well the first week of the spring semester for the first 2 weeks of the spring semester one of those weeks sorry this is the kind of longer poor I just want to update you on everything that's going on if anybody needs any help on any initiatives or writing

a bill if you're a little bit nervous or unsure I'm here for y'all anybody from the executive be more than happy to assist you with any of that just reach out to us give me a call I answer my phone all the time so would that have a great meeting. But that aside student region applications are actually up so I'm going to post that link right now there it is that's the student Regent information and the application so for those of you guys who don't know you get to be part of the Texas state legislature and so the government the governor actually appoints a nonvoting student Regent to represent the UH system so for those guys who may not know Alvaro de la Cruz he is the current student Regent and so it's a very big opportunity I mean you get to be part of the Texas legislature and represent the entire UH system which is very cool one other application that I'll drop right now in the chat as well there it is to be a nonvoting student representative to the Texas higher education coordinating board and so this is a student that represents all undergraduates in Texas essentially so it's a very big position as well so if you're interested in that if you're interested in politics at all I will give my top five recommendations to doctor Walker and they'll go from there and they'll the governor will end up deciding who they appoint so please take a look at those if you guys are interested I will I would love to interview y'all you're all wonderful.

how they can get involved asking more about student government and getting to know more people I actually talked to this this young lady today and I told her that we may be having a class a class Senate seat open soon I think she would be good fit and then she should apply an admin telling them all that they should look at the University committees and that they should try and look at our sea website and see how they all want to access situation I'm just trying to answer their questions about the University in general because there's a lot of them who are very new to you age any other coming up to our table not knowing who we are what we do sometimes talking about it and then offering them a free SG mass so I've already seen a handful of students with them on running around campus and it's always super cool to see your brand out there and it is a really nice Max so if you haven't already you know come by next Wednesday I'll be here on campus distributing as she jackets and as she masks and sit down at a table for a little bit socialize if you want besides that I have a couple senators going out for confirmation Sandra she's going up for undergrad Jose he's going up for tech Brooke she's going up for NSM I interviewed them all yesterday actually very busy day and they were all really great candidates I asked them all great questions and gave me great answers and I made sure that they knew the requirements of SGA the expectations that they make themselves to this organization and I think there all be great additions and I can't wait to see you all to hear them speak we ought to meet them besides that I still do have a couple open seats if Sandra gets undergrad then there will be an open class seat I've already have a handful of applicants apply for it it's already up just in case but so I haven't done interviews for it yet though so if she gets that seat then I'll be looking to fill that that Class C also still have two engineering seeds you know College of optometry College of law college pharmacy there's still a handful of seeds all of it should for the most part be updated on the website and I this next week I may be doing a lot of website updates and making sure that everything looks neat and tidy for the winter break heads besides that like Jasmine said I've recently sent an email to Sergeant about the our walk in the dark participation and I actually believe I got a response today saying that she's going to pass along our observations two facilities and she'll update me when she gets an update besides that I am in the works of creating a virtual event this is really important so if you're not listening to anything else I'm saying this is the most important thing you should be listening to please listen to what I'm going to say I'm creating a virtual event with mindful because they're an organization here on campus that their partnered with I believe you H Wellness and I think it's called like the mindfulness lab but they have a couple of faculty and administrators on there and there's a bunch of student students on there I'm trying to create a virtual event a workshop mindfulness workshop to talk about emotional intelligence and the impact of social media has

- Hey guys yeah so I'm pretty much she actually summed it up pretty well a little • over a year ago we had gotten SGA approval pretty much for I'm just going to read the document it says being further result away though therefore be it resolved by the Senate of the student government Association University Houston University will install a bleeding control kit outside of every automated external defibrillator and stayed on campus I'm going to say we will keep her body like be it further resolved executive order solidly will provide training through including how to properly use the contents of these bleeding control kits and will increase awareness of these classes through marketing across campus and just so that management scope so pretty much we have been teaching these classes but we don't have these kids and the issue is I believe it is issue with the UH Police Department they're not trying to review our proposal that we have typed out we have a proposal with like some case studies and I'm just prices and things like that and it is just kind of stag becomes stagnant it's not moving anywhere so I kind of got put in charge of by trying to get it no brought back to the surface and so I need a little petition today and I was reached out to it given the opportunity to talk to you also I was just hoping that maybe somebody could you know maybe help me get in contact with EU-HPB or just maybe do something to get this done because it's been over a year since we got FDA approval and be home to keep teaching these classes but it's kind of hard to teach the classes and then there's nothing for like instantly where they have been there's nothing for anybody to use like their skills they learn so it's kind of like 1 sided we have like a proposal with all the prices and just case studies and stuff and I really don't know how to talk to a sea comedian before I've never really done anything like this so I don't know but that's really all I had to say I really just would really appreciate if I could not get something done about this because it's been over a year we've been waiting yeah and I guess I just add on so that I believe it was last meeting the Chief Police came and talked about how he would love to help students and I feel like he's really not matching his actions with his words because how can you say that you would love to help students and then you have students come to you with a great proposal that could potentially save lives and you're not really doing anything for them so I just thought that was interesting but I will be posting their petition inside our chat and feel free to sign if you deal with it yeah about the elections I don't really have a lot of updates regarding that I'm really just waiting for things to

- IV. UB 57005 Equity for Student with Disabilities and CSD Support Act (Vote)
  - OK so the CSD bill essentially just represents everything that was written out in the petition so a few of those things are to change the name of this Center for students with disabilities for example make the website more inclusive more accessible have an auction to change the font size and color making changes to the process of how kind of orientation is done in the CSD lengthening those appointment times making sure that we have working buttons on all of the doors and making sure that essentially that we as a University are hearing the needs of students with disabilities and making sure that their accommodations are going through on time having a faculty training to make sure that faculty are not only

treating our students with disabilities with respect but also accommodating them appropriately during a virtual setting something that we saw is that there was very little communication with the CS teaches students whenever one of their counselors was on vacation or was not there was taking a leave of absence there wasn't clear communication between the CSD and the students that the CSD is supposed to be serving so this bill kind of serves as like a paper trail the way that a lot of the bills in the SGA work whenever we have meetings with administration and we advocate to make changes and all of the things that I just mentioned were something that we discussed in the meeting on Monday with the CSD and with several University administrators about the changes that we wanted to be done so all the things that I just mentioned or things that the University has made a commitment that they're going to change for the CSD so that includes the working the making or the creation I should say of a working group that includes students with disabilities on it as well as faculty and staff to continue to advocate for these issues even once this bill is passed and once the initial changes are all met and to continue to collaborate on working on these changes as well so that's pretty much everything I'm there's a lot more in the bill and in the petition but I'm happy to say that that meeting went incredibly well and we should be able to be seeing a lot of these changes happen in the next coming months this semester in the next year so it's kind of a big win for us so I'm pretty happy about that

This allows students who identify as LGBT to know about the resources that are on that are on campus and it also allows them to know about the LGBTQ Resource Center where they do a mentorship program also that won't technically really won't start until the fall of 2021 I spoke to the director personally the other thing about it as well it also lets you know it also lets them know about clubs and organizations that are get involved app as well basically it's going to be highlighting all those type of things I know I would like to give recognition first before anything is I want to shout Jasmine Ann John the director of outreach who helped us with the help me with this we put together a list of organizations Anna clubs to show students there is a lot of students but I'm at 4 so that students can know about all these clubs and organizations but we also did a little bit more research we also found that there is emergency funding for students if they cannot pay for classes their scholarship opportunities as well to anything like that that helps the students LGBTQ students to know about the resources that you have aged provides to them when speaking

to the director there is really not a huge number that qualifies for UH for students that identifies those beach she says roughly there's probably a 7 to 8% of students that identify as LGBTQ but the other thing about it as well is that mainly the bill shows the support for LGBTQ students but also highlights that University of Houston is a part of the campus pride.
