- Senator Miles: Good evening everyone, A last week I mentioned initiative that Matt and I had about getting the Fertitta center to be admitted as a polling place for the open election cycle. I spoke with the Harris County Chief Deputy election Commissioner and got the OK with County clerk's office to make that happen so now, I, the head of the University Houston Democrats as well as the University and Republicans, have created a coalition to speak with the UH administration and so if we could have your support on that initiative that would be very well appreciated but that's a lot to say. thank you!
- Senator Sasser: Good evening everybody. It is another great day for another great meeting now. I'm looking forward to seeing all of us do our thing and being senators and all of our executive positions. Looking forward to hearing everything. Unfortunately, I got stuck at UH for a lovely night because of the flooding. So, that was fun. Luckily, I got friends that love me to spend the night at their place that was fun. Regarding the scholarship, it got renamed and is now called the "SGA essential worker hero scholarship". The reason why they changed it is so that if any pandemic, flooding or hopefully not another covid-19 situation. But if it ever does happen again, SGA in the future can pick up the scholarship and they can put in the money. Besides that, I'm looking forward to hearing everybody's beautiful voice.

- I. Report of the President
 - Hey everyone. Thanks for coming to another meeting! thank you for those of you who signed up for to volunteer at the food drive on Saturday. Unfortunately, I believe that's not happening because the game was cancelled, not surprising. so hopefully, we'll be able to reschedule the food drive. I'm in the planning stages of holding one where students can get their parking citations relieved in exchange for bringing food for people pantry. I also met with Sergeant Padavan yesterday and we are planning in another SGA event it's the SGA walk in the dark event. For those of you who might not know what that is, it's pretty much an event where we walk around at around campus at night with UHPD and we find lights that aren't working or emergency poles or any problems with each infrastructure and then we work with campus facilities to fix the infrastructure. So, if you would be

interested. It's a really fun event and a good way for us to kind of see each other. It is going to be spread out over several days, so we don't have just a giant group of us walking around together. So, the tentative date is going to be the October 5th through the 9th but it should be pretty exciting event. So, I'm also working to host a sexual assault awareness event with election commissioner Chukwu and student life chair Ortiz. The event is most likely going to consist of a virtual Q&A and a feminine product drive. I've already reached out to a potential speaker so hopefully we can kind of get that rolling so we can have a little bit of a virtual event and try to raise awareness. I'm going to let John speak about the end the stigma event that's happened this week or that still happening this week. it's a PR event with UH caps and I also have a bill going up for first read today. it's the Hispanic and Latinx student support act. So, I really appreciate your support on that bill. Now for some less SGA related but still relevant things. so, I know a lot of us have adjusted to the new normal and I just want to remind you all that it's really not normal. it's not normal for us to be going to online school. it's not normal that our government prioritized the health of the economy over the health of 200,000 Americans that died, which is more than the Vietnam War and World War 1 combined, just kind of think about that and each of those people has friends and families that were affected because of that and it's not normal. it's not normal for our country to prioritize profit over its own people. it's not normal that black people fear death when pulled over for routine traffic stop. it's not normal for justice to not be served when a woman is killed in her bed while she is sleeping. it's not normal for the United States to have a history of sterilizing black and latinx people. it's not normal for incarcerated women just fear that they're going to die of a virus. it's not normal for the United States to separate families. we raise the collective consciousness of this country, but we didn't get justice. Today, we were shown that the judicial system is not built for everyone and it's not built to protect everyone. The educational system is not built to educate everyone, and this isn't normal. Texas has one of the strictest voter registration laws in the nation. the Texas Supreme Court blocked accounting clerk from being able to send in Mail-in ballot applications to all voters in 21 states. there is same day voter registration in Texas. the deadline to register to vote is October 5th, which is an entire month before the election. you guys saw how long the lines were to vote on super Tuesday. there were students at TSU, our neighbor and a very historically black University who waited until 3:00 AM to vote and this isn't a coincidence. voter suppression is very real and as young people, we have a huge voting demographic. I know a lot of people might be discouraged from voting in the election, especially if I don't know if you guys are more left leaning. you might not believe in the system. but notice that the system is fighting against you they don't want you to vote. that's why Texas has these voter registration laws that

are so complicated for no reason. they want to suppress your vote, so don't let them do that to you and please register to vote. Tell your friends to register to vote and if you need to be registered to vote, I will personally drive to UH and I will register you to vote so please do that and that's all the updates I have.

- II. Report of the Vice-President
 - Hey everyone, I hope you guys are doing well. In addition to Jasmine's point, the very fact that there's so much voter suppression going on should show you that your vote matters so much that people are scared of it and don't want you to vote. So, please vote!! I think everyone in the Executive is registered to register other people to vote. So, please come to any of us and we will register you. So, SGA updates. I'm working on getting Cougar pack open this fall, but we've run into a lot of issues. there's just a lot to think about so we're working on that and we're trying to think of everything that we can to keep students safe to keep cougar pack employees safe. so yeah, we should be open in the fall and I will keep you guys updated. so, the work groups that you guys have been hearing so much about especially, about social equality and justice, have finally come to an end and they finally have come up with their list of recommendations that they're going to send to the president's task force. Jasmine and I are going to be working on resolution soon in support of a lot of those recommendations. so please keep an eye out for that if you were on one of those workgroups because that is coming. there's a new exhibit thing on at University of Houston that we're very excited about it's called color field and it's going to be a series of like art exhibits all over campus. They're outside and very interactive. they're very beautiful, so please check those out. they start October. I've also been working on ADA Accessibility week, sasser and Maddie, we just had a meeting with the CSD, the director and assistant director. we had a meeting with them, and it was great to action items came out of it. for us one was to kind of support the approval of training for faculty. so that they know how to provide accommodations what they can and can't do regarding accommodations, which we want wholeheartedly so we're working on that. Also, we're setting up a meeting with a couple of people and yeah that's it for ADA Accessibility. so, I had my first safety and security advisory committee meeting which is with the chief of police and a couple of other people and it was honestly really great, better than other meetings that we've had with UHPD. they really care about what we think cause after everyone presents, they always ask what SGA thinks about every presentation. so that's really important, the food drive is cancelled like previously mentioned. I just wanted to say that the essential worker hero scholarship very cool. I'm very excited about that, it's a very good job. Senator Sasser had the idea to write a resolution about Vanessa Guillen, she was a Sergeant at Killeen TX Fort Hood. so, we're working on that. other than that,

please vote. I have one appointment going up today his name is Trevor Woeste, please appoint him. Thank you.

So, if you're a new, every year 1100 T shirts are spread over Butler Plaza to represent the stigma. the T shirts represented the average numbers college students that commit suicide every year. SGA will be donating a total of

1100 masks this year, to registered student organizations, University sponsored organizations and students. every RSO can request up to 50 masks, every USO can request up to 100 masks, every student can request up to five masks and every University program can request up to 150 masks. one once we order the masks a member of the exec board will reach out to you and schedule a time for you to come pick up the masks at the office. other than that, please join us by reposting and sharing the link I posted in the group me. besides that, it's all my updates. hope you guys are having a good day.

- I. Supreme Court Appointment (Associate Justice) Alondra Torres
 - Hi everyone. My name is Alondra Torres and I'm a senior here at UH. thank you for being here and listening to me talk about myself but I'm just going to share a little bit about my interest. My history with social justice issues and more about why would want to be a justice. I'll start from the beginning, I started being really interested in social justice issues when I was a sophomore in high school, and I started reading a lot of books on feminism and environmental justice issues. So, I got really interested and at the time, I was doing a lot of local work at my school and I wanted to branch out and do more outside of school. So, I traveled to China and I stayed there for a couple of months and that was really my first research and farm experience was and I really enjoyed that. I honestly left there thinking like I probably wanted to do this for the rest of my life. so ever since I left, I've been trying to link some sort of environmental justice into anything that I do like any social justice issues. When I came back right after Harvey hit, I knew that the aftermath there would be a lot of need for grassroots organizing and after people weren't getting the help that they needed, or they were getting the help really late. so, my friend and I decided to organize it wasn't like directly to help people that weren't getting help they needed but we decided to organize a youth summit for students of color, so they could learn about gentrification and urban issues things are happening right after Harvey. that was actually like a really large event, so we got a lot of attention but from like local politicians and one of them asked me to be on his radio show. so, I did that after and that was all this is like really new to me and it was all happening like my sophomore junior high school and my senior year of high school because of the summit and because of my other environmental work. I was asked to represent the headsets and environmental coalition here in Houston in San Francisco for a protest that was happening against climate capitalism and decarbonization. so, I went into that and that was just like another thing that really helped me learn about all these different issues and get more involved. I did this my Senior High School and when I got back after I finished senior year, I decided that maybe my efforts would be better and more local and helping my community here in Houston. so, I decided to start working political campaigns and I've worked City Council campaigns, presidential campaigns, state representative campaigns. I'm currently on Angelyn sins Emma field organizer Fran Johnson Ann she's running for state representative in district 134 and that's the number one seed to flip in Texas so to turn Texas blue so please go vote for if you're in the Montrose area or that kind of area but yeah so I've just been really

interested in this for a really long time and I feel like being adjusted it's kind of like the next step to even be more local and do things not just for the city but for also my University and ask any questions but that's just like a little bit of my background and why like everything that's left up to me being really interested in this kind of stuff

I'm currently a member of the Cullen performance Hall advisory committee and with graciously accepted into the emerging leader's program with SGA and I'm looking forward to doing that in the coming weeks. I'm looking forward to more experience with these two positions and helping to contribute more here in your age. so, going off of what the wonderful vice president told

me to say, I'm going to give you guys some of my qualifications about why I think you guys should pick me. so, qualifications for why you should pick me as I currently have a position which is a residential community that helps advertise on their behalf and attract home buyers and I have experience with being given budgets and basically using this advertising on social media platforms mainly Facebook. they would tell me basically how much to spend, how much money I get and then basically tell what posts they want me to boost and attract people. when I was in high school, I was the captain of the speech and debate team and I worked directly with my coach to finance our old tournament. this would involve going to all sorts of local businesses around us to try and see who'd be willing to sponsor events. it was a lot of fun but definitely got experience on the financial side of things. we use the money to help reduce the cost of hosting our tournament. this allowed us to produce a better experience overall for all the students who came. so next what would I do in this role and was my thinking process for the funding. for funding I think my main criteria would be 1. proving the group providing of positive benefit on to a large amount of people basically utilitarianism. we need to make sure that these organizations are helping the most amount of people as they are being funded by the students. all of us we want to make sure the money is being used properly. Secondly, the group needs to be inclusive and accessible to students here UH if they're receiving money from the students, we should prevent them from being a niche group rather and we need to opt for more inclusive program. Thirdly, the members asking for financing have must prove they have a proven track record to show that they would use the money responsibly if they're part of an RSO. To wrap things up, how would I do with conflict because of course conflict will probably be part of any committee as there will be disagreements between all of us. So, my personal belief is meeting people halfway trying to find a solution that gets everybody somewhat of what they want but the organization that would look into there for these organizations I would basically just talk with the people and figure out how much money they're looking for and again meeting people halfway, trying to make sure everybody gets what they want somewhat. I'm very much believing in getting everybody in a room and talking things out I think that's the best way to solve their problems you can solve a lot of problems that way rather than yelling at each other all the time but yeah that wraps up my speech I'm open for questions.

- V. UB 57004 Creation of the Civic Engagement and Advocacy University Committee (First Read)
 - Thank you so everyone if you were a part of last administration you might remember this bill. I presented it last year but honestly I just got really busy and it was towards the end of the administration and unfortunately it just was put on the back burner and it never went up for a vote but I think it's a good time to bring the bill back now and hopefully get it through this time so I created this bill because there is currently no centralized or official Department or group on campus that is responsible for voter registration and civic engagement this is led to from my experience and from others drive heard from UN coordinating often disorganized or somewhat redundant efforts on campus by different groups trying to achieve somewhat similar or the same goals so the purpose and the goal of the bill and the committee is to facilitate collaboration and cooperation on civic engagement related endeavors initiatives on campus amongst different relevant groups organizations and Oregon Department the committee will be comprised of students faculty and student representatives from relevant on campus organization it requires that every year the committee advertised any elections on campus make efforts to register students to vote plan and host at least one large event plan and host or coordinating promote volunteer deputy voter registrar training so that other people can register people to vote and submit report following any large events too I believe is the president the director of external affairs and the speaker just with pros and cons from the with the event when data statistics things like that that would be used in the future also drafted up the bylaws for the committee they were attached in the email that Julian sent out was the meeting agenda so feel free to look at those if you're at all interested in the bylaws it's just some like a more extensive more specific version of the bill.

- VI. SGAB 57012 Hispanic/Latinx Student Support Act (First Read)
 - I was talking to students and had a lot of people tell me that they had no idea that we had a lot of resources that we do have on campus. I know that a lot of people that ran with me for like mentorship programs and that's something that we've had pretty good successes with and one of the questions that was asked to me in the debate was what about the mentorship programs that we already have and that kind of inspired this

bill. when I was doing research, I wanted to compile a list of all of the resources that are available at UH for Latinx or Hispanic students and I wanted to consolidate them and put them all in a place where it would be easy to find. everything would just be in one place. so, this bill essentially creates a section on the SGA website where we will have Latinx/Hispanic student resources and I'll let us list out like academic like minors. for example, there's a Mexican American studies program there's a Latin American studies program people might not know about that so that's going to be listed under academics. then under mentorship program there's mentorship program that was started by Dr. Pacheco I believe and there's other there's other mentorship programs as well they are listed in a document that I've already made myself a Hiba and John. we compiled a list of all of the lot next resources so mentorship programs were on there as well as scholarships were on there and all of the Latinx organizations that you can join on campus as well. I also talked to the head of the Association of Latinx and Hispanic advocates and allies and their president and I wanted to kind of open communications between us cause that's something that was really important to me. I ran an inclusive student support so having open communications between Latinx organizations on campus and the SGA think is really important that way we're able to advocate for any issues that we might have that they might have and that we're able to have a kind of working relationship. So, I'm trying to see if I've missed anything but essentially that's all that this bill does it just adds a section on the SGA website. all the resources and stuff are compiled already as soon as the bill gets passed, we'll put those up on the SGA website and if you guys want to see the list of resources, I would be happy to share in the committee meeting cause it's very long document.

- VII. SGAR 57009 Resolution in Support of creating an NSM Learning Center (First Read)
 - So, this is in support of creating an NSM Learning Center. I think the idea began in 2018 with senators Tanuha, Tomas, Isabel and Sandy created a survey to get students input about whether this NSM Learning Center was necessary and overall students said that it was a really great idea. they loved it and they wanted it but since then, like a lot has happened but not really. I was informed that the creation of this little space was actually approved in the fall of 2019 and it was supposed to be placed in 1st floor of SR2 but since then not a lot has happened. So, this resolution is just showing like helping push administration towards creating an NSM Learning Center. Because I feel like if you want students to come back

and put back into this University then you have to put back into the students. I feel creating this NSM Learning Center will give NSM students an opportunity to have a space where they can learn and be surrounded by other NSM students and as another student I feel like we lack a lot of resources that other colleges have and it's kind of discouraging. As an NSM student, not having access to those same resources and it's like when you graduate why would I want to come back and donate to this University, when I was basically just out here struggling the whole time with no help.

 - We had a pretty in-depth discussion about the budget bill and the internal affairs committee meeting last week. I essentially went through and I compared line by line from the last administration and any changes. the biggest changes I can really say is that I just allocated more specific amounts to other people in the back when like other departments in the exec., so I gave outreach some money, I gave the chief of staff Department some money. whereas I believe like last administration it was just PR & external affairs that got any money and everything else just went either to like office of the president etc. I would say that I think the SGA banquet decreased by like \$500 just because we have all of the decorations from last time that we didn't have the budget, but they ordered a bunch of decorations. So, that's like all in the SGA office. the stuff that you guys see in red is things that were not able to change. so those are like operating expenses UH admin fee essentially is the admin almost like has a tax on everything that we spend. so that's already allocated for the fringe benefit students/staff/employees/student leaders that's all like salaries and compensation everything else. we can pretty much allocate to each Department. I do have some limits on what I can really spend because of the virus and that's why I haven't told any of y'all about polos and some of the other merch that usually we would be talking about right now but I'm kind of limited on what I can purchase and so we're still kind of deciding what we should purchase first. there's a \$5000 funds for the next administration and that's because the administration is

kind of like overlap in the fiscal year and so they need to have some money from us, so they'll be able to spend in the first half of their administration. But like I said we went over it in the internal affairs not much has really changed from last year I just spread the money out a little bit more and that's pretty much it.

So, I figured if we created this committee not only could the council members talk about what's going on in their councils, they could also have a uniting purpose of talking about inclusivity within Greek life. So, I gave a couple of meeting with all of the Greek leaders from all the different councils including the staff from SL and we talked about it there was pretty widespread support for it. you can see that all of the councils cosponsored it. they gave any feedback that they gave me I incorporated into the bill. so, I won't say too much else about it, other than upon the passing of this bill, Hiba and I will make an application and some marketing materials. so we can try to incentivize the great community to apply for this committee and it will be in the bylaws so hopefully the next administration will take a look at it and they'll choose to continue it but essentially it would work I'm the same way as the University committee applications work
